JUVENILE COURT

Durham County Plans to Institute New Method for Conducting Courts for Juvenile Delinquents to Increase Efficiency.

It has just been learned that Durham county is actively considering the establishment of a juvenile court of a more improved type than is possible under the clerkship of the county superior court.

The production of this idea comes not only from citizens and officials of the county itself but also from the Durham Crime Study club, in whose discussions some of the University sociology and psychology faculty and students have participated during recent months.

It is significant that this interest can be shared by representatives of Duke University, who form an important part of the civic group, and representatives of the University. It shows the growing spirit of co-operation between the two institutions.
