New Head Has Served On Faculty For Past Thirty Years

Mangum To Teach

Dr. William deBernier MacNider, for the past 30 years a member of the faculty of the University pharmacy school, on September 1 succeeded Dr. Charles Maple Mangum as dean of the medical school.

Dr. MacNider, who is a graduate of the school that he will head, was appointed to the post after Dr. Mangum asked to be relieved of his duties so that he could devote more of his time to teaching.

Here Since 1905

The new dean received his medical degree in Raleigh in 1905 and has been connected with the University as professor of pharmacology since that time. A grandson of Dr. William Peter Mallet, the first University physician, Dr. MacNider is the son of the late Dr. Virgilus St. Clair MacNider, native of Chapel Hill.

The new dean has received world wide recognition for his research into diseases of the kidney, particularly Bright's disease, and together with his teaching ability, was named a research professor in 1924. He has held several important chairmanships in committees of leading medical societies, and his writings have appeared in many leading medical journals.

Kenan Awards

Four University professors, Harold D. Meyer of the sociology department, Richmond P. Bond of the English department, William S. Jenkins of the department of political science, and Milton S. Heath of the school of commerce, have been awarded Kenan leaves by the trustees for the fall term to do special work on research projects, it was announced today.

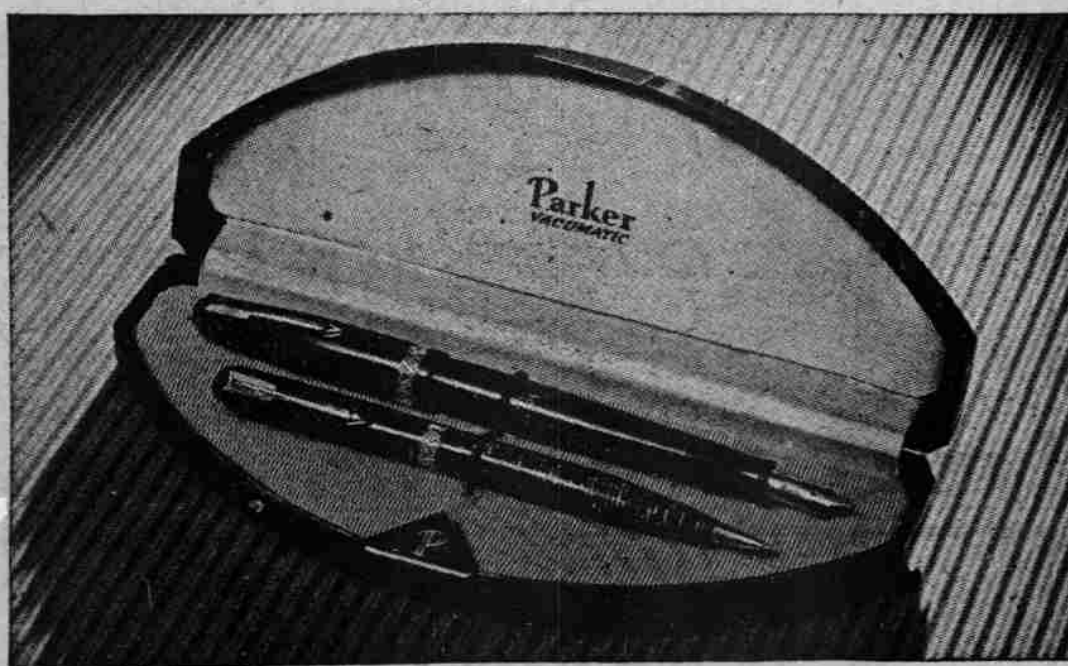
