 By Robert Rolfe By Robert RolpeFrom the Michigan State's campus to Fordham's Rose Hill came Four Horseman Jim Crowley in 1933 to lead the Rams out of the football wilderness into five years, Sleepy Jim has made Fordham a football power to be reckoned with while winning 26 games, losing seven, and tying four, and making the Rams famous for their suicide schedules and their jaw breaking names. Crowley was schooled in foot ball by the greatest coach tha ever lived, Knute Rockne Sleepy Jim was one fourth of the most illustrious backfield tha ever donned moleskins and
cleats, Notre Dame's 1924 Four Horsemen. He was the running back of that famous group, play ing at left halfback.
