Content Of Economics Course Is Announced

Buchanan Will Be Professor For Spring Quarter Class

Economic, sociological, and political aspects of the affairs of Japan, Russia, and China will be dealt with in Economics 137, open to upperclassmen and graduates during the spring quarter, it was announced yesterday by the commerce department. Professor D. H. Buchanan,

who will teach the course, has taught and studied in the Oriental countries for 13 years, and has published several works on them, notably on Japanese rural life and on economic life in India. His doctorate at Harvard was given for work in this field.

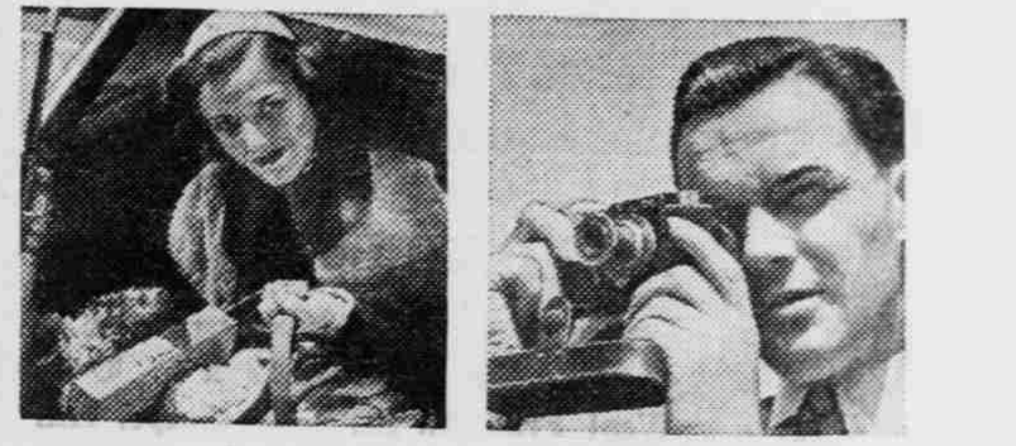
