to ask for the release of the war prisoners.

According to Vichy dispatches passed by censorship, he was in the mood to protest the "intolerable" conditions of the German-French armistice and ask for a just and permanent peace.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24 — President Roosevelt today said that the multi-billion dollar defense program is America's answer to foreign propaganda that the United States is "effete and degenerate and cannot survive before the march of dictatorial powers."

WASHINGTON—The War department today split the army's air might into four separate districts as part of the nation's program to safeguard the entire Western hemisphere from invasion.

LONDON—(Friday)—British leaders said last night that Adolf Hitler, with an eye on the United States election, may be trying to induce the French government to join the axis in a "war guilt" demonstration against Great Britain.

BERLIN—Spain is drawing closer to Germany and Italy as an "ally" to avenge wounds she has suffered at the hands of Britain it was stated semi-officially today.

LONDON—(Friday)—German warplanes fanned out to raid scattered British objectives from the channel to Scotland and Wales last night and early today, bombing a few London districts and in one of them trapping a number of persons under wreckage.

ROME—Adolf Hitler has arranged with General Francisco Franco for Spain's early entry into the war to be followed by a combined Italo-German-Spanish assault on Britain's Gibraltar fortress it was reported tonight in Fascist quarters.

LONDON—Relays of British bombers heaped explosives upon Berlin with deadly accuracy early today, spreading destruction and lighting the sky over the German capital with angry red flames, the Air Ministry said today.

Second largest item is the \$1,500 to pay for the senior share of junior-senior dance expenses. The junior class will match this amount.

Other appropriations are: auditing and bookkeeping, \$10; supplies and materials, \$15; senior week, \$400; senior gift, \$350; athletic awards, \$16; donations, etc. (to campus organizations), \$100; general expense, \$50.

Estimated expense totals \$6,178.50. With \$999.05 brought over from last year, the class' estimated capital for the year will be \$6,224.05. This leaves an estimated cash balance of \$45.55, which is marked on the budget, "for reunions, etc."

Regulations

(1) A player may challenge another player not more than three positions above his own rank with the exception of the first six positions on the varsity and freshman ranking board. In this case he may challenge not more than two positions above his own rank. (2) An official challenge must be made by entering the challenge and date on the challenge board and allowing the challenged player to accept. (3) The challenger must notify the challenged player immediately. (4) All matches will be the best two out of three sets. (5) If the challenger wins his match, he replaces the challenged player who moves down one position. The challenger then cannot challenge the same player for the period of one week thereafter.
