

Behind the masterful five-hit hurling of Monk Whiteheart, the Carolina baseballers turned in a 2-0 whitewash performance over Maryland yesterday on Emerson Field to register their second Southern Conference victory.

Whiteheart pitched superbly all the way, fanning 13 batters, including at least one every inn-Carolina 3 ing, and allowed no walks. Six consecutive strikeouts, two to end the fourth, three more on ten pitched balls in the fifth, and one to start the sixth, were 2 the highlight of his mound performance. 


