Reds in Iran Send No Report To UN Council

Tehran Believes Soviets Have Left

New York, May 6-UNO Secretary General Trygve Lie says he has not yet received any report that the Soviet evacuation of Iran has been completed. He has promised newsmen that any such report, from either country, would be made public Publications immediately. The council has set midnight tonight as the deadline for the Russians to clear out of Iran.

However, the official government spokesman for Iran, Prince Firouz, hints that a statement on the Soviet army evacuation of Iran may be issued after midnight. Firouz says that so far as he knows the Red army has completed its evacuation of Iran but no official word on the withdrawal has come from Soviet Publications Board after a meet- ment of the student union buildauthorities.
