Tar Babies Shoot for Third Victory; Boseman Receives Mound Assignment

Carolina's junior varsity nine will attempt to gain revenge for a previous loss to the Duke Jayvees this afternoon, when they tangle with the Blue Imps at Durham.

Coach House has named Bill Boseman as the probable starting pitcher, with L. C. Couch to be called in for relief, if necessary. Sid Varney has been named as the starting catcher for today's game.

The remainder of the jayvee lineup today will include Norm Galinkin at first, Bill Walker at second, Junior Hayes at short, and Buster Stevenson at third. The outfield will have Emmett

Cheek or Tom Clayton in left, Ott Evans in center, and Bill Webster in right.

The game today will be the eighth start of the season for the Tar Babies. The jayvee record stands at two victories against five setbacks, including the earlier loss to Duke. Three of the Tar Baby losses have been to professional teams.

Carolina Scores 7-5 Win Over Davidson

Trackmen Set For Duke Meet This Saturday

Carolina's cindermen are holding intensive workouts this week in preparation for their meeting with the Duke Blue Devils Saturday at Durham, in what will be the most important dual meet of the year for the Tar Heels.

Duke will be rated about a 15-point favorite when the arch-rivals clash on Saturday, on the basis of previous performances this year. The Blue Devils have recorded wins over South Carolina and Virginia, with their lone loss occurring at the hands of a powerful Navy team.

Two Victories

Carolina has a season record of two victories against one setback. The Tar Heel trackmen opened the season by crushing a strongly-rated Georgia Tech team by an 86-45 score. The following Saturday, Coach Dale Ranson's men bowled over the University of Virginia cindermen with an 87-39 victory. Last Saturday at Annapolis, the Tar Heels ran up against a superior Navy team on a wet track and Carolina came out on the short end of a 102 1/3-28 2/3 score.

The track staff hopes to pick up more points in all events, especially in the field events, by developing a better all-around squad this week, with the emphasis on teamwork rather than on individual performances.

In the hurdles, Coach Dale Ranson has three men coming along to back up Chunk Simmons. They include Dick Taylor, winner of three second places and one third in the previous meets, Hunter Heggie and Don Mitchell.

Netmen Score Fifth Shutout With 9-0 Win

Wallop ORD Sextet Without Losing Set

Greensboro, May 7—In keeping with their usual performances, the Carolina netmen won another 9-0 victory yesterday by adding the Greensboro ORD sextet to their list of shutout victims for the second time in this campaign.

The triumph was the most decisive of the season for the Tar Heels, as they dropped only 15 games while winning every set. The 13th victory of the year, it was also the fifth consecutive whitewash.

Carolina Captain Harold Maass was the only Blue and White netman to be extended to more than three games as he defeated R. B. Finch, 6-3, 6-2. Sam Daniels trounced Sam Williams with the loss of only one game, 6-1, 6-0, and Stan Gruner subdued Ed Zinser by a 6-0, 6-2 count for his 12th win of the campaign, 6-0, 6-2.

Straight Love Sets

At the number four post, Jim Nicholson fashioned his 10th triumph in consecutive love sets over Bill Cook. Don Skakle walloped Ed Boland, 6-1, 6-0, to remain unbeaten in eight encounters, and Dick Swigart set back George Lee, 6-2, 6-1.

In doubles, Maass and Gruner trounced Finch and Williams, 6-1, 6-0, Nicholson and Skakle combined for a 6-0, 6-2 victory over Cook and Boland, and Daniels and Duke Wilder blanked Zinser and Lee in straight 6-0 sets.

The next tilt for the Blue and White racquetmen will be Saturday, when they journey to Duke to battle the Blue Devils for the second time.

Harry Beason's ninth-inning homer gave the Tar Heels a 7-5 victory over Davidson yesterday in a Southern Conference tilt played at Davidson.

The Tar Heels get their third crack at the high-flying N.C. State nine this afternoon when the two teams clash in Emerson Stadium at 4 o'clock.

With the score deadlocked at 5-5 after a see-saw battle, Beason broke up the game with his first round-tripper of the season. Charlie Cole, who had made his

third hit of the game, scored ahead of Beason.

John McElrath started for the Hearmen and gave way to Vinnie DiLorenzo in the seventh. DiLorenzo finished to notch the triumph.

Already defeated once this week and blanked with two hits last month by the Wolfpack, the Hearmen will be seeking to hand the Big Four leaders their second loop loss of the campaign while racking up their own second triumph. Carolina's only league win was a 4-2 decision over Duke fashioned by Monk Whiteheart.

Coleman to Hurl

Hamp Coleman is slated to take the firing line against the heavy-hitting Wolfpack. The Red Springs freshman's last mound chore was against Wake Forest when faulty fielding and insufficient hitting sent him down to his second defeat. Opposing Coleman on the mound will be Ernie Johnson, who hurled the two-hitter against the Tar Heels last month.

The Tar Heels will drop into a last-place tie with Wake Forest should they lose this afternoon. The light-hitting locals will probably start the same team that bowed to State Monday.

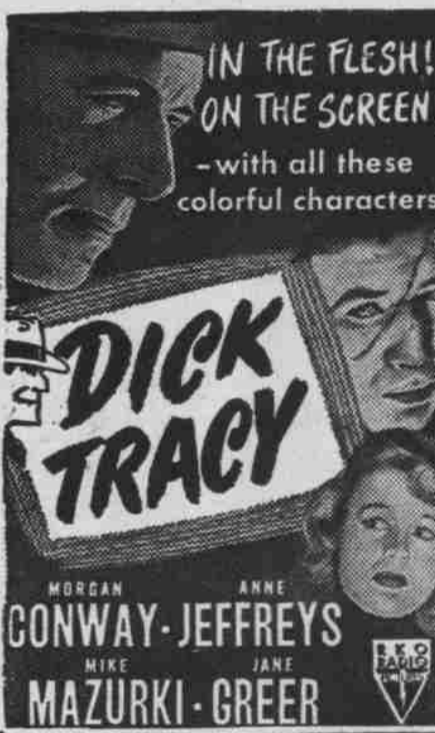
