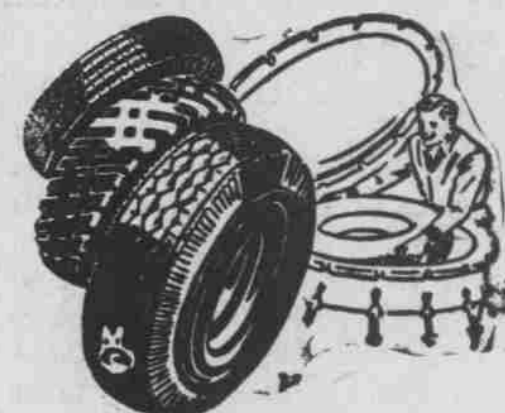
MATHEMATICS SEMINAR
