Dr. A. P. Hudson Corrects Report Regarding New Teacher-Rating Bill

Dr. A. P. Hudson, chairman of the faculty committee on General College instruction, yesterday corrected a misquotation of his statement to the Student Legislature Thursday night during discussion of a bill to set up a system by which students would grade their instructors.

An account of the discussion which was printed Friday morning reported Dr. Hudson as saying that 6,100 teacher-rating scales had been distributed to instructors and department heads by his committee upon the recommendation of the University Board of Trustees.

"I am reported to have said that the action had been taken on the recommendation of the University Board of Trustees," This statement is inaccurate," Dr. Hudson said yesterday.

"What I did say in reference to the Board of Trustees was that the visiting committee of the Board in its report last winter had expressed doubts about the quality of teaching at Chapel Hill. This fact I cited as one reason

why the faculty committee on General College instruction assigned the teacher rating scale now in operation among the faculty and students.

"I should like to state, furthermore, that the faculty committee on general college instruction had nothing to do with the inoperating of the bill introduced into the Student Legislature. The author of the bill, Mr. Miles Smith, told me that he had not even heard of the teacher-rating project sponsored by the committee.
