### Golden Fleece Taps Pritchard; 18th This Year **Graduate Started** Blue-White Series

Bill Pritchard, former president of the Monogram Club who graduated last March, was tapped into the Order of the Golden Fleece this week, Fleece spokesmen announced yesterday.

As president of the Monogram Club, Pritchard inaugurated the series of Blue-White games, the most recent of which was held last weekend.

The Fleece neophite was initiated just one week after the men's honorary society took in 17 new members, a week ago Monday night. The organization took 16 students and one faculty member at that time, also retapping John J. Pritchard of Charlotte, a distinguished Fleece
