Sound and Fury's first production of this season, "Oh, Bury Me Not," will open a two-day run tomorrow night in the Memorial Hall. Curtain time is 8 o'clock.

The show, a musical, will be presented against a western background, with the action taking place in a wild west saloon.

One of the outstanding features of the production is that the show, unlike most of its S & F predecessors, has been completed in production prior to opening night. Probably most of the credit for providing the campus with a finished product is due Mike Casey, the director for this show, who has done everything from playwrighting to set designing. Indeed, Mark Barker, president of S & F was looking for a "booster" musical to boost his organization's dramatic standing on the

campus. He found the music, gobs of it, in a collection of numbers by the talented Frank Matthews. Barker then contracted Mike Casey to take charge. Casey did take charge but, after casting and planning the set for the show, found that no book had been written.

After learning that a script had been ordered through that S & F department but that no writing had yet been done on it, Casey set to work and turned out in one weekend a choice series of gags and all the other things that go into a good comedy script. He built the show around the fabulous character of Diamond Lil, the part of which, incidentally, is being played by Flossie Wolfe,

who gives an excellent interpretation.

Casey's first experience in directing was for a musical comedy done by the "Savoyards" at the University of Notre Dame. Taking his undergraduate work at Williams College, in Massachusetts, he was president of the dramatic society, "Cap and Bells," and also acted as director for two years of the Adams Memorial Theatre at that college.
