Freistadt Achieves Answers To Einstein Gravity Theory

S&F Begins Rehearsal On Quarter's Musical

"Fifty Grand," the new Sound and Fury winter show, was launched into production at Memorial Hall last night with some twenty people attending the initial rehearsal. True to S & F form, the play is a musical comedy, depicting fifty years of college life at Carolina.

Five acts take four principal leads and a chorus of fifteen through the more outstanding events of each of the decades since 1900. The show is on tap for a three night stand starting February 28.

Written by S & F President Mark Barker and his wife, the script to "Fifty Grand" provides numerous popular songs, such as "Goodbye Broadway, Hello France," "Harvest Moon," "I'm Just Wild About Harry," and a new hit, "I'm a Carolina Coed," to the tune of "Yankee Doodle Dandy."

The dialogue is devoted almost entirely to gag lines, many of which will be presented by the comedy team of Jane Milligan and Jim Mills.

The love plot is centered around Wilma Jones, as Dora, and Bill Rogers, as Tom, who represent in each act or "decade" of the play the typical Carolina coed and her "Gentleman."

Hans Nearly Attains Answer, Says Professor

An ingenious mathematical way to solve approximately the equations in Albert Einstein's Generalized Theory of Gravitation was reported today by self-admitted Communist Hans Freistadt, graduate student in physics.

Freistadt caused nation-wide comment last May when it was discovered that as a Communist he had received a \$1,600 Atomic Energy Fellowship. Deprived of fellowship by the Atomic Energy Commission, he is now working on a doctorate degree in physics here, which he hopes to complete by June.

Dr. Nathan Rosen, who is directing Freistadt's research in the University, said that his work so far was logical and that although the equations are almost impossible to solve completely, his reports are significant.

Several papers on the new theory were presented at the February meeting of the American Physical Society in New York City, but Freistadt's is supposed to have caused the most talk. "The equations which Einstein derived are very difficult to solve; yet it is important to have solutions to find out if these equations yield the usual gravitational and electromagnetic fields, and some interaction between these two fields," Freistadt said.
