Men of the Fourth and Fifth Marine Divisions made the initial assault landings. They carved out a precarious beachhead on the eastern shore of the island. Navy and Air Force bombardments had pummeled Iwo's defenses for 62 consecutive days.

Before noon the Marines had smashed through heavy defenses to move inland about 500 yards. The beachhead extended some 4,500 yards northward from the base of Mt. Suribachi. Some 7,000 Americans were ashore.


