Lacrosse Squad Preparing For Season Opener April 1

The Tar Heel lacrosse squad resumed practice yesterday afternoon terminating a two week layoff. Coach Bill Darden, who was recently named as one of the assistant coaches of the South All-Star squad, put his charges through a rugged two hour workout which ended with a short scrimmage.

Carolina's stickman will open their season on April 1 against a favored William and Mary squad which won a two to one decision over the locals last year. The Tar Heels will complete the week with contests against such strong "tens" such as Williams, Lehigh, and Delaware.

Coach Darden will stress conditioning throughout the remainder of this week and will probably schedule a full scrimmage on Saturday afternoon.

Rollins Rally In 7th Frame Beats Locals

WINTER PARK, Fla., March 21.—(AP)—The Rollins Tars banged out five runs in the seventh inning to break a 3-3 tie and defeat North Carolina, 9-4, here today. The win gave an even break in the two game series.

The five-run uprising came with John Vitasek on the hill. Freshman shortstop Rusty Williams started the inning with a single, went to second on George Whidden's sacrifice and scored on Harry Hancock's single. John Gray reached first on Shortstop Joe Brookshire's error and when Buzzy Rodenbaugh walked the bases were full. Buddy McBryde and Lyle Chambers singled successively to bring in three runs and McBryde scored the fifth tally on an error.

Reeves' double with Will Hobbs and John Senter on base gave the Tar Heels their first two runs in the fourth. A walk to Brookshire kept Hester's single and Hobbs' single gave another in the fifth. The final North Carolinian run resulted from a walk to John Clements and Pitcher Hoover Surlas' triple.

Tennis Schedule Opens Friday With Ohio State

Carolina's tennis team, under the direction of Coach John Kenfield, will open the 1950 season Friday afternoon against the touring Ohio State Buckeyes.

The Tar Heels will present a veteran line-up and seem to be ready for a successful season. Last year the netmen lost only one of 23 games. Although Vic Seixas and Stan Gruner, first and third men last year, have not returned, Coach Kenfield feels that the team will be better balanced.

The team started workouts before Christmas and, except for a few minor scrapes, is in good shape, with all members ready to start.

Leading the locals will be captain Clark Taylor, a four year veteran and highly ranked among collegiate players. Taylor, who was number two man last year, will move up to number one this year.

Charlie Rice, Don Skakle, and Duke Wilder, all with three years of experience, will be on hand this year, as will Heath Alexander, who was ineligible last year. Jim Winstead, former intramural champion, Les Dameron, and Paul Kenan

round out the top eight.

This will be the first time that Carolina and Ohio State have met in tennis and little is known about the Buckeyes. They lost to Davidson yesterday in Charlotte, 10-0.

The Carolina tennis team will play a 26 game schedule which includes games with many of the top college teams in the East, South, and Middle West. Prominent in the line-up are matches with Miami, Davidson, William and Mary, Michigan State, Michigan and Harvard.

This should be the year for the Tar Heels to make their best showing for they have strength right down the line, whereas last year they were not so well balanced. Even though this will be the last year for most of the top bracketed players, there are strong reserves up from last year's freshman team.

Hugh Bowman, Jim Hammerstein, Shahan Haroutunian, Lou August, Bob Kerdasha, Bob Luxemburg, and Dick Sheets fill out the rest of the squad.

Florida Relays First Stop For Carolina Track Squad

The Carolina track team will open the 1950 outdoor season this weekend, competing in the annual University of Florida Relays, a two-day affair at Gainesville.

Coach Dale Ranson was still undecided yesterday when asked to list the trackmen scheduled to compete at Gainesville. The head track mentor said that workouts yesterday and today would go far in determining who would make the trip.

A squad of nine men is expected to make the trip according to Ranson and it will consist of one and possibly two relay teams with several men running in the open events.

Dave Willis is expected to compete in the 100-yard dash while Bob Morrow will probably compete in the 120-yard high hurdles and Jack Moody will high jump. These three won Conference championships in their respective events in the 1950 indoor meet which the Tar Heels won handily in February. Bob Kirk in the javelin and Turk Ogden in the shot put are the other Tar Heel entries.

A distance medley relay team (880, 1/4-mile, mile and 2-mile) will probably go to Florida. According to tentative plans Halstead Holden, Frank Hooper, Gordon Hamrick and Sam Magill would make up the team. Carolinas 1940 team set a record for

that event and the mark still stands.

The first home meet is scheduled for next weekend when the Tar Heels are hosts to the annual Carolina Relays.

Lefty Schacht Pitching Star On Gator Trip

Following their opening-game loss to Florida with a pair of victories, the Tar Heel baseballers have been rounding into shape on a vacation-long spring training trip.

Improving with each of the three contests, Carolina turned in its best performance Monday. Sophomore lefthander Henry Schacht pitched the first complete game of the young season in defeating Rollins, 3-1.

Schacht was in control all the way, striking out five without giving up a single walk as his mates pushed three runs across in the fourth inning for the victory.

The trip didn't start out at all well, however, when the Tar Heels met the University of Florida in Gainesville last Friday. The Gators blasted to a 7-5 victory; the second time in a row they've turned the trick on opening day.

The biggest disappointment against Florida was the failure of Veteran Dean Cassell to go more than four innings. Cassell, expected to lead the Carolina mound staff, gave up six runs in the first three innings and was charged with the loss. John Vitasek, a sophomore, came in to finish the contest and gave up a single tally in the five frames he worked.

Vitasek also cleaned up the next day against the Gators and got credit for Carolina's 7-6 revenge victory. Vitasek was called on in the seventh to rescue reliever Lotes Holmes and was on hand when Carolina scored twice in the eighth to break a 6-6 tie. Ed Gaston, a letterman, started for Carolina, but was chased in the fourth when the Gators made three runs.

Schacht's six-hit performance against Rollins and Vitasek's steady relief work were tops in the pitching department.

Thomas To Miss NCAA Swimming

Carolina's swimming sensation, Jim Thomas, will not participate in the NCAA swimming championships to be held at Ohio State University of Columbus, Ohio. Thomas was taken sick last week and did not swim in the Eastern Intercollegiate championships at Annapolis, Maryland, during the past weekend.

Norm Sper, the only Tar Heel representative to place in the Eastern swim meet, captured third place in the 100 and 150 yard backstroke events and garnered another third in the one meter diving. Robert Heston of Yale edged out Sper in the diving by five-tenths of a point for the second position.
