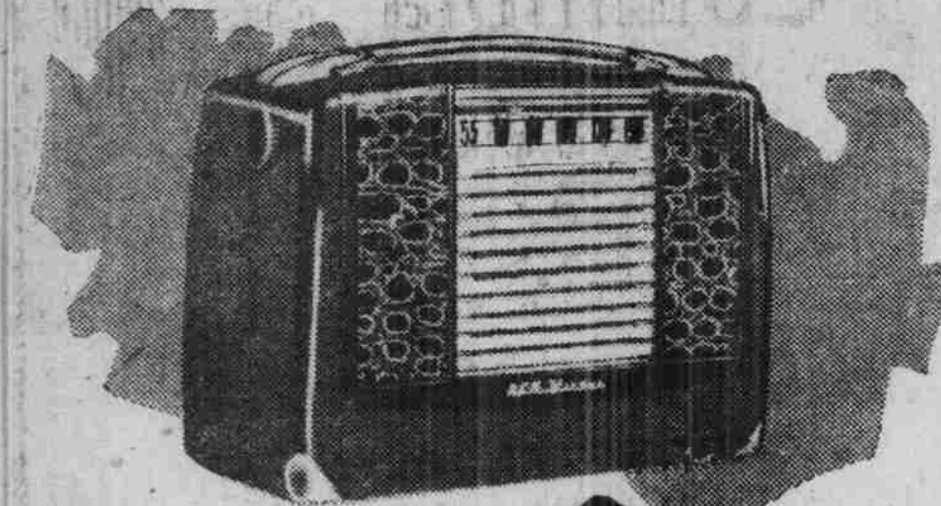
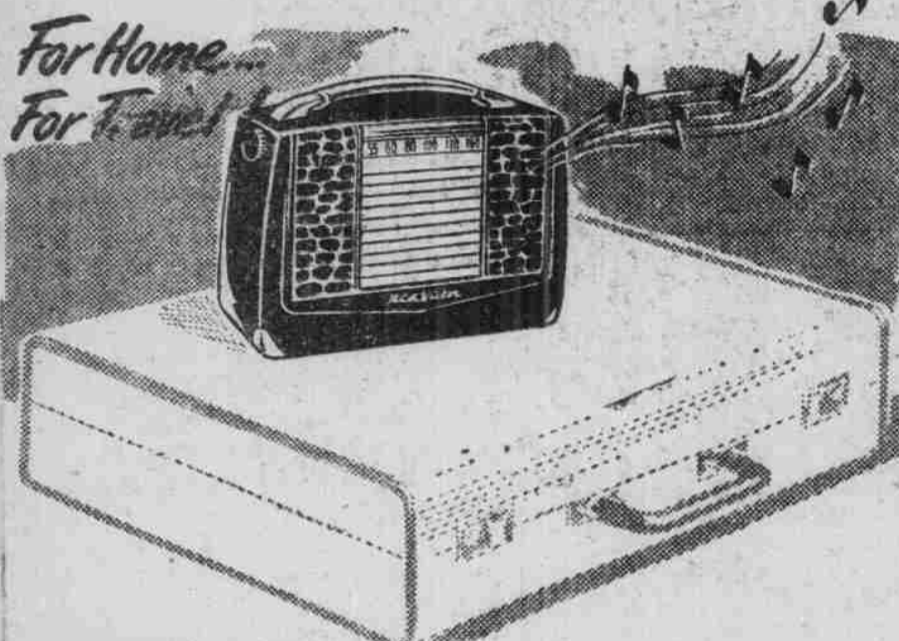

State Students Want To Handle Own Money

A resolution to regain control of student funds, now handled through college administration, was presented by North Carolina State to a meeting of the Greater University Student Council meeting there last Saturday.

The NCS students are asking for a system similar to that used at UNC and WC, which permits students to decide what fees will be.

At the meeting, attended by Carolina students Don VanNoppen and Tom Sully, a report of the Projects Committee also was discussed. Three of six proposed projects for the year's work were adopted. They include:

A second Greater University Day to be held at Raleigh during the Winter Quarter. If held the Day will feature a basketball game at the Coliseum and a reception or tea-dance, plus other activities for the three schools. The proposed dates are Feb. 2 and Feb. 24.

Establishment of a Publicity Committee for the Council to consist of representatives from each school for the purpose of adequately publicizing all student activities on all three campuses.

An attempt to exchange class lectures between faculties of the three schools.
