Referee Frank Sykora stepped between the fierce battlers as the squad Bronx Bull sagged and grabbed Sugar Ray's trunks to avoid a knock down. LaMotta, game but badly beaten in the last five rounds, clutched the ropes and wandered to his corner under his own power.
