Anniversary Planned Here By Phi Gams

There will be due cause for celebration in Chapel Hill this weekend when Epsilon chapter of Phi Gamma Delta formally observes its 100th anniversary on the campus.

The festivities get underway tomorrow and continue through Saturday.

With a history reaching back to the winter of 1851, Phi Gamma Delta is among the first, if not the first, of its brotherly breed in the state of North Carolina to complete a century of existence.

Phi Gams, as they have come to be known, have had a long and turbulent career in Chapel Hill. They have twice become dormant, but their charter has never been revoked or surrendered. 
