## Book Written By Scheer

George F. Scheer, sales and advertising director of the University of North Carolina Press, is a contributor in a new book of stories for children which will appear next month.

In "Coonskin For A General," a volume of stories about great American cities, Scheer wrote a chapter on Richmond, Va. The author is formerly from that city.

The work marks Scheer's first juvenile work, although he is a well known book reviewer and is a former newspaperman.

A similar book is projected for next season by Aladdin Books, New York publishers, containing a North Carolina story with Scheer as author.

Meanwhile, he is working on a full length western for boys for the same publisher.

Scheer has been with the University Press for six years.
