Entries must be fiction, containing not less than 3,000 nor more than 6,500 words, and may be sent in by anyone who has not sold more than three fiction works in the past five years.

Any type of story or subject matter will be accepted, but not more than one entry may be made. The name of the author must not appear on the manuscript. It should be enclosed in a sealed envelope bearing the title of the story and attached to the manuscript.

A first, second and third cash prize award will be made and the name of the first prize winner engraved on the club's silver cup. The winner is awarded possession of the cup until it is won in a subsequent contest.

Three copies of the manuscript must be mailed to Mrs. Lee M. Kerns, contest chairman, Beatty's Ford Road, Charlotte, and must be postmarked before midnight Tuesday, December 25. Announcement of the winners will be made at the January dinner meeting of the club.
