

Presidents To Discuss ACE Curbs At March 8 Meeting

The presidents, faculty advisors, and athletic directors of the Southern Conference schools will meet here March 8 and discuss whether or not any of the individual schools are bound by the American Council on Education's program for curtailment of athletics, President Gordon Gray announced yesterday.

"We are going to study the American Council on Education's decision with a view toward clarifying its impact on us," Mr. Gray said. "There is a good deal of confusion of the matter now. Mr. Wade (the Southern Conference commissioner) is confused and the people at State are confused on the issue."

NCAA vs ACE

The confusion lies in whether the American Council of Education or the National Collegiate Association is the ruling body for the nation's colleges. Most educators feel that the NCAA is the ruling body and will continue to abide by its decisions until a meeting is called and other decisions are made. At present, no meeting has been called until next January.

"President Case of Colgate was quoted as saying the program is in effect right now," Mr. Gray said, "but I don't know of anything binding except perhaps public opinion and moral suasion."

Abolished scholarships

The executive committee of the ACE Saturday in Washington, D. C. unanimously approved a platform of curbs calling for banning all post-season games, limitation of seasons for sports (which would eliminate spring practice) abolishment of athletic scholarships; prohibition of freshmen on varsity teams and other reforms designed to combat the "infestation of college sports."

"I don't agree with the entire program they have adopted," said Mr. Gray. "However," he continued, "I don't know how much the reports in the press have telescoped the wording. I haven't seen a text of the program so I can make no public pronouncement on a matter I'm not certain about."

Mr. Gray, chairman of the president's group, will recommend

that the March 8 meeting be open to the press. The meeting held here September 28 which recommended banning of bowl games was open.

Practice Not Changed

Football coach Carl Snavely said yesterday that "We will go right ahead with plans for spring football practice as ruled by the NCAA until the University authorities tell us to stop." Coach Bill Murray at Duke made a similar statement Monday.

The feeling at the Athletic Association here is that the NCAA is the spokesmen for the presidents of the nation's colleges and the delegates to the convention are appointed by the presidents.

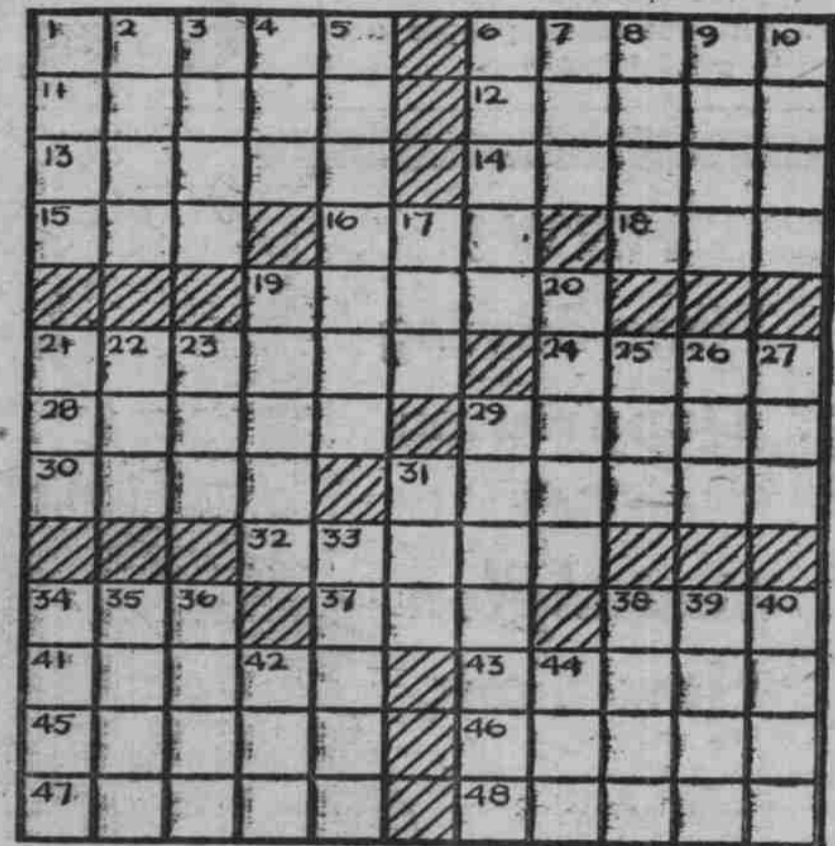
