Summer French House Set June 10-July 15

Eighth annual session of The French House, one of the features of the first term of the summer session, will be conducted here by Prof. Hugo Giduz of the romance language department from June 10 through July 15, it was announced yesterday.

The French House is open to students and teachers of French who wish to improve their conversation as well as take advanced courses in the language. The group remains together, taking meals at the house and participating in evening entertainment there. The women students all live under one roof. Men are housed in nearby dormitories.

Necessarily limited as to enrollment, Professor Giduz suggests that those wishing to be a member of the French House this summer make early reservations.

In addition to Director Giduz, the staff consists of Mrs. Charlotte V. Huse, instructor in The French House since it was founded in 1945, and Prof. Walter Creech of the romance languages department.

Professor Giduz was recently honored by the French government by being named "Officier d'Academie" for "services rendered to French culture."

The French government has shown interest in the House by granting an annual scholarship and other awards. This summer Miss Frances Watson of Sanford and a teacher in the Clinton high school will hold the scholarship.

One of the other outstanding awards is a \$150 scholarship presented by Prof. Edward T. Draper-Savage of the romance languages department in memory of his mother. This award is "to be given to that student who, in the opinion of a committee named for this purpose, will have shown at the completion of the course, an outstanding interest in France her culture and civilization, and a corresponding ability and promise in his or her mastery of the French spoken languages as well as literature."

In addition, The French House will award two service scholarships at \$50 each at the beginning of the course upon application by students for financial aid.

The French House will come under the regular University rules and students will have access to all physical facilities as well as opportunity to take courses for credit. Evening lectures, motion pictures, plays and other entertainment will be included in the schedule.

Women's Rooms

Women students now in residence and expecting to return for the summer or fall quarter (or both) must make room reservations by April 1. Rooms will not be held for students after that date.

They must make a six dollar deposit, at the Cashier's window in the basement of South building, for each quarter.

Peruvian Prof Visiting Here

A professor in the oldest university in the Western Hemisphere, San Marcos University in Lima Peru, is a visiting professor this quarter at the oldest state university in the United States in point of operation.

He is Prof. Manuel Garcia-Calderon of the San Marcos University Law School faculty and member of a distinguished Peruvian family, who is teaching a course in the development of international law in the political science department here.

Professor Garcia-Calderon is at the University under the auspices of the department of political science and the Institute of Latin American Studies of which Dr. Sturgis E. Leavitt is director.

In addition to being a member of the Law School faculty, Professor Garcia-Calderon is director of the central library at the University of San Marcos and is a practicing lawyer in Lima. He is a member of the Peruvian Society of International Law and the Peruvian Bar Association.

When San Marcos University celebrated its 400th anniversary last year UNC was represented by Dr. Harold Bierck of the history department.
