The first two Carolina men at bat got hits yesterday, but that ended the offense for the Tar Heels who were shutout, 4-0, by Wake Forest's freshman righthander, Rudy Williams, on just four hits in the opener of the Big Four play.

The Tar Heels could muster no power and their star fastballer, Chal Port, did not have his usual stuff, giving up five hits in 31/3 innings, including a homer, a triple, and a double. The only bright part of the picture was the fine relief work of Bill Lore, who pitched shutout ball and brought his total of scoreless innings to 241/3.
