

Tar Babies Meet 'Pack At Raleigh This Afternoon

Local Squad Looking For Fourth Win

Carolina's once-beaten junior varsity football team will meet the North Carolina State Wolf-pack in Raleigh's Riddick Stadium at 3:00 this afternoon.

This will be the Tar Babies fifth game of the season. They have won over Fort Bragg, Virginia and Wake Forest, while losing to a strong William and Mary squad.

Julian King, who is acting as coach in the place of regular mentor Ted Hazelwood, will field virtually the same starting line-up that have appeared in previous games.

The offensive line will have Van Weatherspoon, a Durham junior, and Bobby Lee at ends. Don McCormick and Ray Craben will be at the tackle positions, with Tom Maulsby and Bill Prothero as the starting guards. Bill Koman will be the center.

The Tar Baby split T attack will be quarterbacked by Ed Laughlin, with senior Ernie Liberati also expected to see action at this post. Liberati was the star in Carolina's impressive victory over Virginia.

Johnny Lameroux and Vince Murray will be the starting half-backs. This is the first time either boy has been a starter. Flo Worrel and Billy Hawkins have now been moved up to the varsity. Billy Joe Johnson, who starred against Wake Forest, will be the fullback.

The defensive forward wall will have Harry Anderson and Norman Lane at the ends. Veteran Harry Pruss and Dick Pucci will fill the tackle spots, while Bill Giles and Roland Perdue are the guards. Backing up the line will be Baxter Mangum on the right side and Bill Reeves to his left.

Carey Lawrence and Charlie Pindexter will defend against State aerials from the halfback posts. Liberati is at safety.

Very little is known about the State team. All of their competition has come from Southern Conference foes. The little Wolf-pack has met both Duke and Wake Forest this season.

Reserve guard Sid Hardisty is the only Carolina player who will be sidelined with an injury. Hardisty has an injured ankle.

Netters Meet Virginia This Afternoon At 2

The Carolina tennis team will play the University of Virginia tennis team this afternoon at 2 o'clock in a match which has become an annual affair.

The match is always held on the weekend of the football game between the two schools and was won last year by Virginia when Carolina had to go without the services of their ace Del Sylvia who was out with a pulled muscle.

However, in the regular season, Carolina won the match between the two schools.

Coach John Kenfield expects the Virginia team to be very strong this year as they lost only one man from last year's squad. Coach Kenfield can go this record one better as he lost no one from last year's lineup.

The singles lineup for Carolina will not be the same as last year's, due to the fact that three of last year's performers have been beaten out by freshmen.

The number four position, held down last year by Sam Handel, will probably be filled today by Tom Bradford, a very good prospect who may move higher in the lineup in the spring.

Bill Izlar played in the number five position last year but his place has been taken by Don Thompson of Jackson Heights, N. Y.

The number six position, which was by far the weakest on the team last year, will be filled today by Bruce Gustafson of Washington, D. C.

Another promising freshman, Pete Green of West Palm Beach, Florida, will probably be given a try in the number one doubles today with Del Sylvia.

The first three positions will be the same as last year. Del Sylvia, Southern Conference singles champ, will be in the number one spot. The two and three positions

will have Herb Browne and Bob Payne, who won the Southern Conference doubles crown together last spring.

The team has been engaging in a fall practice since the beginning of school but this is the only match scheduled for this period. They will continue to practice until the weather makes it impossible.

The schedule for the spring has not been completed but will probably be about 24 matches including Harvard, Yale, Michigan State, and possibly Princeton.

Halfback Bruce Hillenbrand is the leading ground gainer on the Wake Forest football team this fall. The Arlington, Va., junior has gained 214 yards in 43 rushes for an average gain per play of five yards. Fullback Joe Koch is second with 202 yards in 50 carries for a four-yard average per play. Wake Forest plays N. C. State here Saturday at 2 o'clock in Groves Stadium.

Changes In Starting Lineup Head Carolina's Last Serious Practice Before Virginia Game

Outstanding changes in the probable starting lineup in tomorrow's game with Virginia marked Carolina's football practice yesterday, the last serious drill the Tar Heels will go through before the game.

Changes at halfback to increase power and speed and make up for injured players will be made by Carolina coach Carl Snavely and his assistant on offense, George Barclay.

Sophomore Larry Parker, who switched from right to left half for the first time last week, is scheduled to start at left half. Either Chal Port or John Gaylor, a former fullback who has been injured since the opening game, will start at right half.

Coach Snavely has made three changes in the offensive line, Carolina's weakest point so far this season. Bill Kirkman will start at center in place of Dave Mullens, Jim Neville is at right guard in Ed Patterson's old spot, and freshman Jim Lambert starts

for the ailing Steve Opitz at tackle. The changes are designed to add more blocking power in the line.

Patterson is switching from his guard spot to Junior Seawell's position at left linebacker on defense. Seawell is one of Carolina's co-captains for the game, but has been injured and will see only limited action against Virginia.

Carolina hasn't scored a win over Virginia since 1949 when Charley Justice and company sweated out a 14-7 victory here in Kenan Stadium. The Tar Heels think that's a good sign, however, as tomorrow's game is the first time the two teams have met here since the Carolina win. The Cavaliers racked up wins in Charlottesville in 1950 and 51.

Carolina is definitely out for this one. If the Tar Heels don't win, the seniors will never see victory over Virginia while they are here, and Carolina will drop its eleventh straight contest.

Virginia is equally up for the game, as it was knocked off the

unbeaten list week-before-last by Duke, and had a sure win snatched away by South Carolina in the last two minutes of the game last week.

'Dad's Day At Duke University

Sponsored by the Duke YMCA, the program will give fathers a special opportunity to visit the University and take part in campus activities with their sons. This year, for the first time since World War II, Dad's Day will honor fathers of men in all four undergraduate classes. Formerly, Dad's Day was limited to the fathers of freshmen and sophomore men.
