He will visit Ecuador, Peru and Chile in addition to Colombia. On their return trip, the Leavitts will stop off in Mexico to attend the sixth Congress of the Instituted Internacional de Literatura Iberoamericana, to be held there August 31-September 3. Dr. Leavitt was one of the founders of this organization and attended the first Congress held in Mexico in 1938 as United States delegate. He was for 15 years associate editor of its official organ, the "Revista Iberoamericano." While in South America Dr. Leavitt will lecture on the following topics: "The Foreign Student in an American University," "Drama in North American Universities," "The Dramatic Art of Lope de Vega," "Early Cultural Contacts Between the United States and Latin America," and "Latin American Literature in the United States." While in Peru he will give a seminar on Spanish American Bibliography at the University of San Marcos.


