

Lefty Davis Humbles UNC Once Again, 4-2

Wake Forest Southpaw Misses Shut-Out Because Of 2 Errors

Bruton's Fine Relief Work Comes Too Late; Bruce Holt Gets Three Hits; Long Stars Afield

Coach Walter Rabb's Carolina baseball team failed to beat Wake Forest's Lowell "Lefty" Davis for the third time this season as the Deacons whipped the Tar Heels, 4-2, yesterday afternoon at Emerson Field.

Davis, who set down the Carolina boys 6-1 and 6-2 earlier in the year, allowed seven hits, three by Bruce Holt. He struck out five, including clean-up batter Joe Mosier three times.

Lefthander Jim Searce started for the Tar Heels but was through after only one inning in which Wake Forest scored three times on two singles and two doubles. Doug Bruton came on in the second and was touched for only four singles in the final eight frames.

Carolina missed a golden opportunity to score in the initial stanza when Harry Lloyd's infield hit was followed by two straight walks. But Fred Dale, who had forced Lloyd, was cut down at the plate attempting to score on a wild pitch.

Bruce Holt led off the second inning with a solid hit to center but was left stranded at first. But in the fifth frame, Ed Hooks singled over third and went to second on an error. Al Long then singled to left to drive Johnny Woods, running for Hooks, across the plate.

The Tar Heels picked up their final run in the sixth when Connie Gravitte scored on an error. He had singled and moved around on Holt's safe blow. With the tying run on second base in the same inning, Harry Lloyd popped out to end the threat.

Frosh Victorious

Two Tar Baby athletic teams, the tennis and baseball squads, came through with wins against Big Four opposition yesterday. The undefeated freshman netters, paced by Ed Hudgins and Bob Bortner, whitewashed the Duke Blue Imps on the varsity courts, 8-0, yesterday afternoon. And the Tar Baby baseball team, faring much better than their varsity counterparts, topped the Demon Deaclets, 6-2, in a game played at Wake Forest yesterday.

Bruton, who is becoming the workhorse of the Carolina mound staff, was very effective in his relief chore. Only in the fourth, when Billy Lyles and Ben Tatum singled for the Deacons' fourth run, was he in any trouble.

Al Long made the fielding play of the season when he caught Harry Lloyd's drive in the ninth with his back to the plate.

Newton Sets Track Record; Is DTH Athlete Of The Week

Last Saturday was a big day for racing. At Churchill Downs, determined won the Kentucky Derby and at Duke Stadium, Carolina's Jeff Newton set a new school record, a new Duke Stadium record, and tied the Carolina-Duke dual meet record when he ran the 100-yard dash in 9.6 seconds. For his outstanding performance against the Blue Devils, Newton has been chosen as the Daily Tar Heel Athlete of the Week.

Record setting is nothing new to Newton. His first record was set in the First ACC Indoor Track Meet held here last winter. Newton turned in a 6.2 performance in the 60-yard dash for the conference record. Despite his great showings, the dark haired, 20 year-old from Raleigh has had little track experience. He ran only three meets as a freshman, four as a soph and four more as a junior. Newton had no high school track experience when he entered,

Carolina.

"We knew he had talent," Coach Dale Ransom said about Newton, "but he has been spending most of his time playing football." Newton is probably most famous for his two touchdowns against Notre Dame last season. "This should really be his sophomore year in track," Ransom continued, "but he graduates in June." Coaches Ransom and Joe Hilton agree that Newton has done "an amazingly good job considering his limited competition."

Newton's 100-yard performance against Duke was one of the most exciting races seen this season. "It was neck and neck almost all the way between captain Harry Brown and Newton," Ransom relates. "It wasn't until the finish line that Newton edged ahead of his teammate. He won the race by inches." Newton also runs the 220 and ran that race in 21.5 seconds against the Duke harriers. Despite his performances the Tar Heels lost to Duke, 73½-57½.

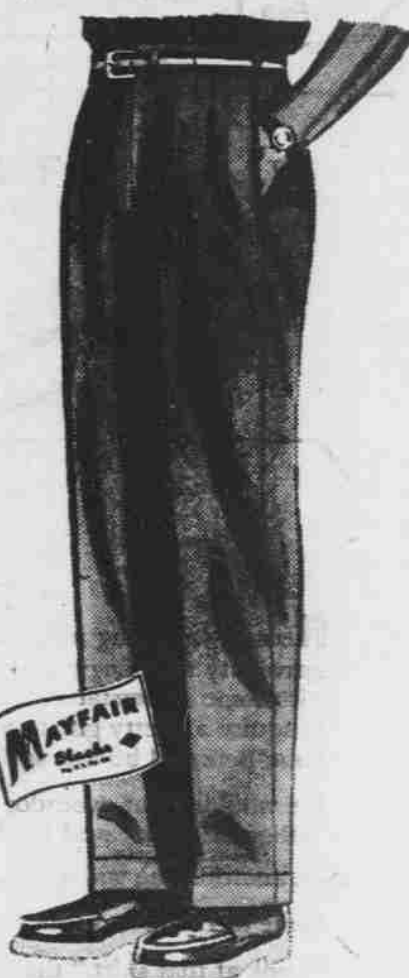
