## Ballot Box

Curry dropped by yesterday and confirmed something.

Asked if he was going to win on the University Party ticket Tuesday, McCurry said: "I'm still hopeful.'

Ballot Boxscore stood like this as of yesterday:

Don Fowler, Independent presidental candidate, has made six statements so far. He has said he is for leaving fraternity affairs to the Interfraternity council; he favors a student Constitution amendment reconstructing the Student Council; wants a "junior partnership" between students and administration; is in favor of a "spirit of unity" between campus political parties. He disagreed with Student Party Candidate Manning Muntzing that a student traffic court

should be set up. On segregation, Candidate Fowler gave (like the other candidates) a very weak statement. He (like the other candidates) had to be asked for a statement concerning the Supreme Court's ruling. "As American citizens,"

Presidential hopeful Ed Mc- ; said Fowler, "we must take cognizance of" the fact that "the Supreme Court has abolished segregation." Folwer called for a "great deal of consideration" and asked students to "strive for a solution which will benefit all citizens of North Carolina."

Fowler entered the campaign as an independent March 14. His campaign is being managed by Gordon Forester.

#### FOUR DAYS UNTIL ELECTION

University Party Candidate Ed McCurry, who became a candidate March 7, has seven statements to his credit.

McCurry wants to give students 25 percent of campus store profits: he wants changes in the cut system; closer liaison between students and student government; a sub-Graham Memorial in the old Vets' Club building; high school student government workshop: closer work with dormitory residents.

Like the other candidates, Mc-Curry had nothing to say on segregation. He admitted it, though.

On March 7, the Student Party named Manning Muntzing its candidate for president. Muntzing chose Sam (Buddy) Wells his campaign manager. Muntzing has seven statements beside his name.

The SP candidate wants a student traffic court; a study day at the ends of semesters (like WC): return on dormitory vending machine profits; he's "aware" of the UNC Band's situation; he doesn't like the high cost of tickets for students dates at athletic events; he has made what he called a statement on segregation-"I hope that the student body and student government will work together to meet the situation"-and he wants weekend social facilities to be ex-

All presidential candidates have lifted items from each other's programs. They have not been ashamed because they lift-

They need not be ashamed. None of the items mentioned so far has been controversial enough to worry about .- F. P.

### Amendment Deals With Interdormitory Council

Four amendments to the student Constitution will be presented to the student body for a vote in Tuesday's election. One proposed amendment, to give student government Attorney General specific powers, was published yes terday. Two others are printed today. The first, below, deals with Interdormitory Council. The second, on page four, concerns student nurses.

#### A BILL TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL STUDENT CONSTITUTION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA

Whereas: Through practice, Interdormitory representatives, elected by the individual dormitories, have taken the place of advisors appointed by the University as members of the Interdormitory Coun-

Whereas: Interdormitory Council officers elected in the spring automatically hold over and eliminate the necessity for any other hold-

Whereas: A social program in the residences, as directed by the Interdormitory Council, for the residents of the dormitories has proven very effective; and

Whereas: A chairman and clerk of the Interdormitory Council Court eliminate the necessity of a hold-over member of the Court;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT LEGISLATURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA, THAT

Article I. The official student Constitution of the University of North Carolina shall be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Article I, Section 10. Men's Interdormitory Council. The Men's Interdormitory Council shall be composed of the presidents of the men's dormitories and the IDC representatives elected by the dormitories. The Men's Interdormitory Council shall choose its own officers in the spring to serve until the following spring. The officers of the Interdormitory Council shall have the power to authorize and carry out dormitory elections, and no election shall be valid without their authorization.
