Gravitte Paces UNC Stickmen

Carolina's baseballers head down the homestretch in the ACC race this weekend as they take a two-day trip into South Carolina for games at USC and Clemson.

The Tar Heels, winners in three of their last four games, are currently holding fifth place in the ACC ahead of sixth place Clemson and seventh place Duke. Clemson plays Virginia Friday while the Tar Heels meet USC and Saturday's game at Clemson could develop into a battle for fourth or fifth place.

Following the trip the Tar Heels have only three games remaining on their regular season schedule, one with N. C. State at Raleigh and games with UVA and Duke here.

Connie Gravitte continues to lead the Tar Heels at the plate with a .379 mark. Tom Zachary is second with .281 and Dick Hudson of three hits in four trips against moved into third at .280 by virtue Duke Wednesday.

The lanky Baker, who will replace injured regular attackman Wilbur Jones, has looked exceptionally well at playing in the "crease" in practice.
