ley, Darwin Bell, Bill Pruitt and Hudgins.

Following is Davis' complete announcement:

"I would like to challenge students, faculty, and townspeople who are interested and have suggestions regarding the parking problem on Columbia Street to be present at the Traffic Committee meeting on Oct. 11, at 4:30 p.m. in Graham Memorial, Roland Parker I."

"I would especially urge members of the University Party with their 'little group' to be present at this meeting. My committee is strictly a non-partisan group, working for the betterment of the parking conditions on Columbia Street and the campus as a whole. We can only be successful if all groups can work with us and through us in solving the problem," he said.

"Student body President Young and President of Interfraternity Council Ed Hudgins, did not have a solution to the problem, as has already been stated, but were appealing to the Board of Aldermen Monday night to lift the ban permanently or to lift it until a workable plan agreeable to all could be worked out. We must have one plan acceptable to all involved and approach the Board of Aldermen and Merchants' Association as a student body standing together, rather than a multitude of 'little groups,'" he said.
