

'Old N. C.' Data On TV

For the first time, students of U. S. history in high schools throughout the state will be able to see this week, through television, exhibits of original materials from colonial North Carolina.

The first North Carolina in-school television remote telecast will be produced by WUNC-TV and broadcast by cooperating television stations, today at 9 a.m.

The programs, part of the United States History course designed for high school students, will originate in the North Carolina Room of the U. S. Wilson Library.

Miss Lois Edinger, television teacher of this course, will interview Dr. Hugh Lefler, Kenan professor in the UNC Department of History and author of the North Carolina history text used in North Carolina Public Schools. Dr. Lefler will give an account of the colonial history of North Carolina.

William Powell, director of the North Carolina Room, will discuss much of the material displayed

Membership is open to all University students who qualify on the basis of audition and interview, Fred asserted.

A busy schedule for the instrumental group this year includes trips with the football team to Maryland, Wake Forest and Duke, as well as presentations at all home games.

Mason, director of the chorus, said that group is devoted to the

presentation of "outstanding" masterpieces of vocal literature.

Principal presentation of the fall semester will be Honegger's "King David." The University Symphony will also be featured in the program.

Following this program, Mason said, the University Chorus will appear with the University Band in a special program featuring Percy Grainger as soloist and composer, and will present a number of Grainger's work under his direction.

Rehearsals for the chorus are being held twice weekly—at 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday and Friday. Auditions for new members will continue throughout next week.

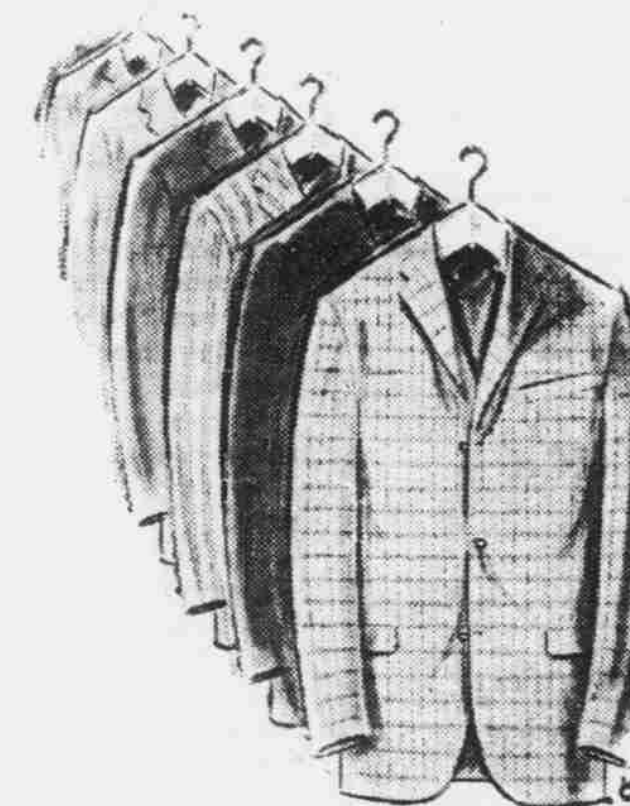

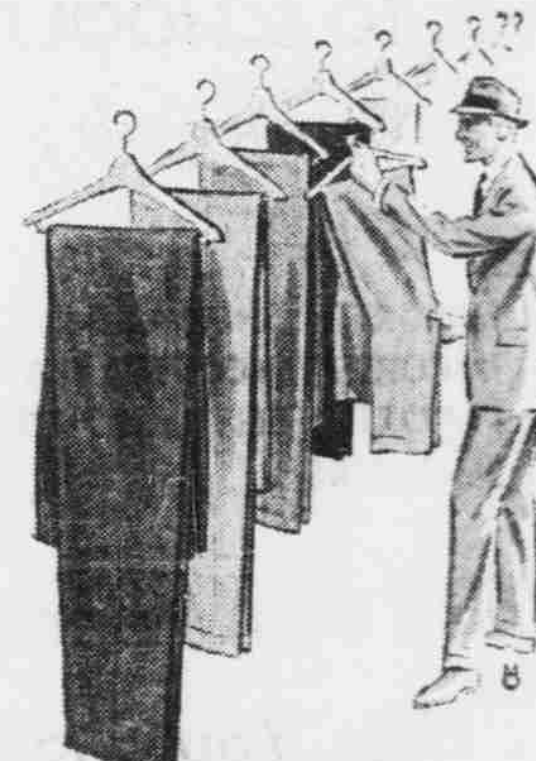
