ities and six fraternities have made donations thus far.

Goldsmith stated yesterday that the goal of the Symposium budget may run into excess of \$5000. If several well-known speakers are engaged, it will probably come nearer a \$6000 total, he said.

The main part of the budget will go for expenses in securing and entertaining speakers and paying their travel expenses to and from Chapel Hill.

"The fund-raising campaign is coming along as well as expected," Goldsmith stated. "I am quite pleased with the interest being shown by fraternities. I hope they will all have made contributions to the Symposium before our campaign is finished."

Delegate David Matthews said that having women on campus is a great aid to those students who might have difficulty in getting to Greensboro.

Matthews refuted the claim that W C is sufficient for the education of the state's women. He said that just last year one of the Greensboro institution's buildings partially collapsed.

Dean of Women Carmichael, who was present to defend the women, said that America is facing a manpower shortage, and that women are needed to furnish the additional required leadership.

Guest Mary Carlton thanked the delegates who thought coeds cause their dates, academic difficulties. She said it was a compliment to women for people to think that dating caused men to flunk out while their dates maintained good grades.

Delegate Coolidge was named by Critic Jess Stribling as the outstanding speaker of the evening.
