#### **United Church** Schedules **Yule Concert**

There will be Christmas selections by Pergolesi, Berlioz, Bach, Handel, and several folk songs. The Youth Choir, directed by Mrs., Shiela Jameson, will sing caroly; from France, England, and Polanil. The climax of the service will be the presentation by the Sanctus ry Choir of Clokey's cantata, "Wl en the Christ Child Came", directed by William Sasser. Thelma Sariser is Organist. 
