man of the National Consumers Advisory Board.

Dr. Graham, who is a Fayetteville native, was the organizer and first president of the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies. He has also served on the President's Com-

mittee on Education, and was the founder of the Citizen Library Movement.

A 1909 graduate of UNC, Dr. Graham is a Phi Beta Kappa and has received the Doctor of Literature, Doctor of Laws and Doctor of Canon Law degrees. He has also studied at Columbia, Harvard, Princeton and Temple universities, as well as the University of London.

After his speech tonight, Dr. Graham will be honor guest at a reception in the GM Main Lounge.

Sanford Voters Committee Opens Campaign Office

The Young Voters Campaign Committee for Terry Sanford has opened its headquarters over the Old Chuck Wagon Restaurant beside the Post Office.

Student leaders, Jim Crownover, Young Voters chairman for Sanford, Jim Hunt, State Assistant Manager and Ed Knox, president of State College Student Body, met with Sanford supporters yesterday. "Things look good," said Hunt. "We're going to have to work, but we're going to win... we must make this a personal crusade."

Crownover asked for student ideas for the campaign. He emphasized the need for everybody's help in establishing good government.

Davis Young, editor of The Daily Tar Heel, outlined the paper's stand on political issues.

"The Daily Tar Heel will make an effort to acquaint the student body with the major events in both the state and national political picture... an attempt will be made, particularly on the state level to give equal time and space to all candidates."
