

# 1959-60—A Year Filled With Many Strange Things

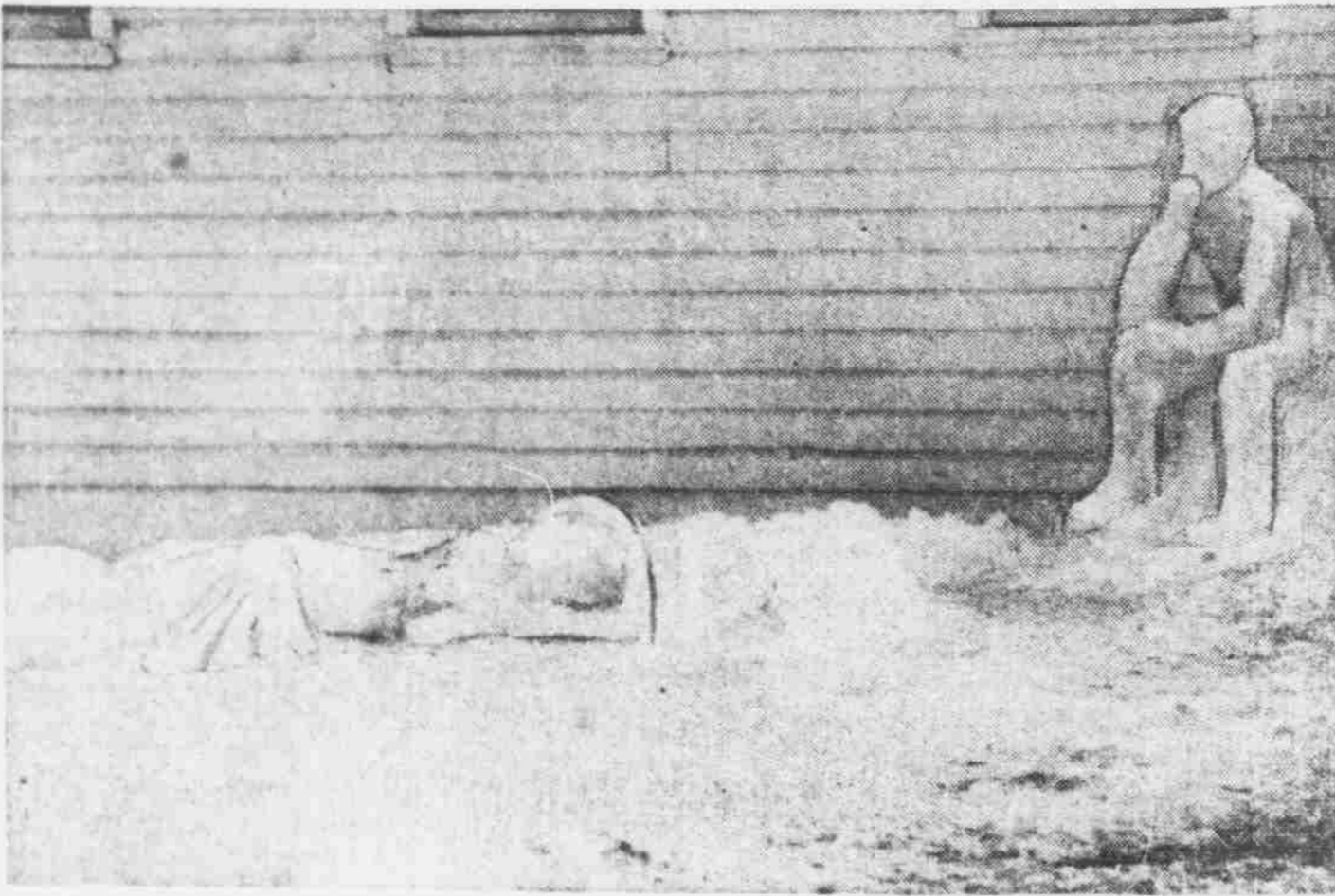

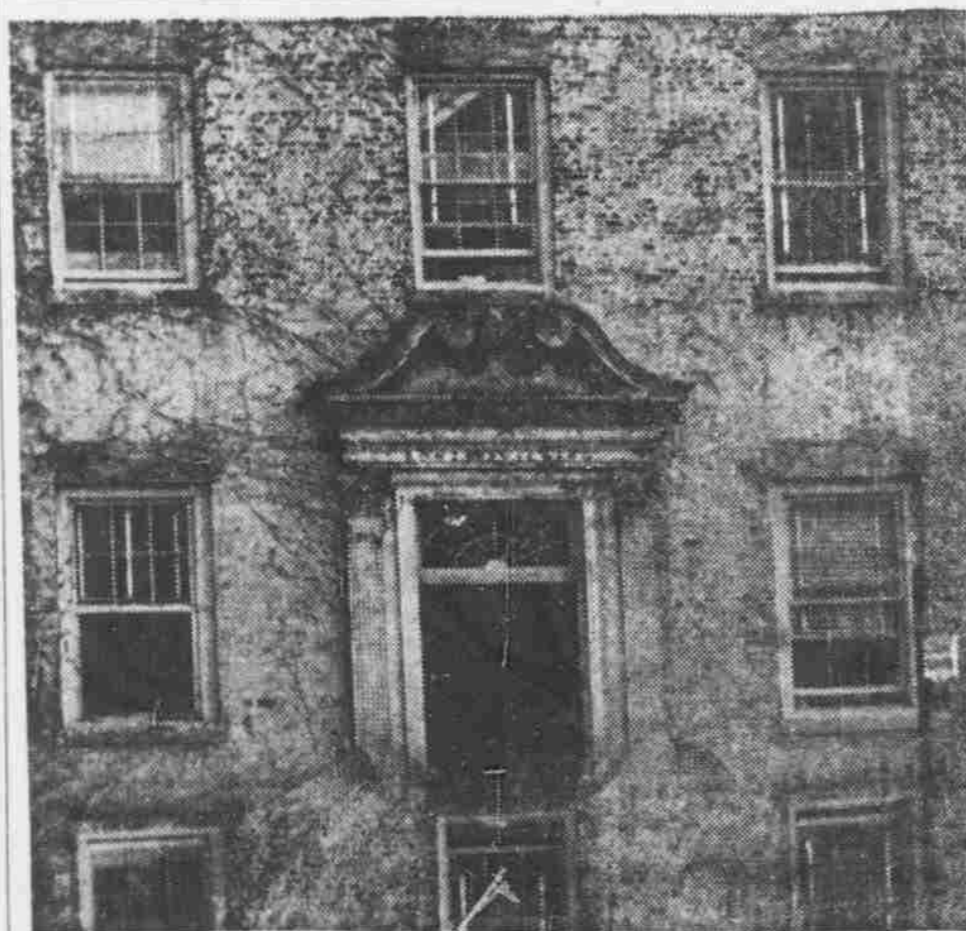
