# **UNC** Bacteriologist Headed For Baylor

Dr. Kendall Owen Smith who "has made significant contributions to the knowledge of how viruses invade living tissue cells" in research utilizing a powerful electron microscope at the UNC School of Medicine, has accepted a position at Baylor University in Houston, Texas.

Dr. Smith, a Ph.D. graduate in bacteriology in the UNC medical schools and a native of Wilson, N. C. has been since August 1959 a postdoctorate trainee of the U.S. Public Health Service, working with Dr. Gordon Sharp in the newly-established biophysics laboratory in the School of Medicine here. Dr. Smith has worked with Dr. Sharp in experiments using the electron microscope, the laboratory device that "can see and count the minute killers (viruses) and trace their course of invasion."
