Medical School To Dedicate Blood Research Laboratory

A new research laboratory for the study of abnormalities of the blood, primarily in a unique colony of hemophilic dogs, the only such colony in the world, will be dedicated by the School of Medicine Sunday.

blood, particularly hemophilia. Hemophilia is a hereditary bleeding disease which was formerly thought to occur only in human males. For a number of years a colony of dogs having a disease apparently identical to human hemophilia has been studied by the Department of Pathology.

The new unit is the Francis Owen Blood Research Laboratory, located just out of Chapel Hill at the University Lake. The laboratory is named for the late Francis Owen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fredrick C. Owen of Durham.

Dr. W. Reece Berryhill will preside at the dedication exercises.

The dedication exercises for the new facility will be held in the School of Nursing auditorium at 2:30 p.m. and a tour of the laboratory will be held at 3:30 p.m.

The various features and planned uses of the new laboratory will be explained by Dr. Kenneth M. Brinkhous, chairman of the Department of Pathology.

The laboratory is a part of the Medical School's Department of Pathology. The new \$87,000 structure, containing over 5,000 square feet of space, will be used primarily to house and study the colony of hemophilic dogs.

Dr. Ernest Allen, chief of the Division of Research Grants, National Institutes of Health of the U.S. Public Health Service, will represent his organization at the dedication.

African Leaders Seen Turning Toward Influence Of Soviet

Nikita Khrushchev may have lost a battle in the Congo but he has by no means lost the war in Africa.

It was a diplomatic setback for Khrushchev when 17 African states of the United Nations rejected the Soviet charge that U.N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold had bungled in the Congo and, instead, urged that Hammarskjold continue "vigorous" action there.

By setting himself up as a "strongman," Mobutu also neutralized Premier Patrice Lumumba who had relied chiefly on the Soviet for outside support.
