

Hodges Visits UNC To Talk On Economics

Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges visited Chapel Hill for a short time last Friday.

The former governor of North Carolina addressed a meeting of the University of North Carolina—R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company Summer Fellowship Program in Economic Education.

Hodges, a UNC graduate, spoke to the group for about 30 minutes in the Hill Dining Room of the Carolina Inn. He discussed the role of the Department of Commerce in United States economy and told of some of his recent travels as Secretary of this Department.

Secondary Educators

The group he addressed consisted of 60 secondary school educators in the social sciences from the ten south eastern states. The program in which they are participating is designed to broaden their understanding of economics.

Hodges was introduced to them by UNC Chancellor William B. Aycock. The Secretary's talk was informal; he spoke without a text on general economic situations from the government's point of view.

The teachers will hear several other outside speakers during their program, said Roy Holsten, Assistant to the Dean of the School of Business Administration and Coordinator of the Economics Program.

Three Classes

In addition to hearing speakers, each participant in the program is taking three courses for credit in economics. The courses are given by the School of Business Administration and the Economics Department. The program lasts through out the first session of summer school.

Hodges had flown to Chapel Hill from Danville, Va. He arrived in town about 1 p.m. and left shortly after his talk at the Carolina Inn, reported Holsten when questioned by the UNC News.

Pollitt Examines Racial Laws

In an article published Sunday in the North Carolina Law Review, UNC Law Professor Daniel H. Pollitt explores the President's existing powers to effect change in ten areas of racial relations. They include the military service, federal employment, federal contract employment, education, housing, voting, health, recreation, and transportation.

In his discussion of transportation, as in his discussion of other areas, Professor Pollitt sets forth the "existing fact situation," court decisions, administrative regulations, and what action is now available to the President. He concludes, regarding transportation, as follows:

"The law is clear; the violation is plain; what can the President do about it? There are several obvious remedies.

ICC Violations

"First, The Interstate Commerce Act makes violation of Interstate Commerce Commission orders illegal, punishable by a fine of \$5,000 for each day of violation. (In 1955 the Interstate Commerce Commission ordered the end of Jim Crow terminals.)

"Second, the Civil Rights Act of 1960 makes it a crime punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, for anyone to prevent, obstruct, impede, or interfere with, the due exercise of right of the performance of duties under any order, judgment or decree of a court of the United States.

Instruction Media Now On Exhibition

New kinds of equipment in the education field are on exhibition at the School of Education here during the North Carolina Conference on the Newer Media of Instruction. The conference exhibit began Tuesday and will end at noon today.

Specialized exhibits include a manually operated teaching machine; "The Controlled Reader," an audio-visual aid which measures eye fixations and analyses individual reading techniques; a language laboratory equipped with tape recording units, tape or record playbacks, and head sets; and "programmed textbooks," texts which are set up to allow the student to work through the material, take tests and check his work at a rate according to his ability.

Audio Equipment

Other audio equipment which is also on exhibition includes: motion picture projectors, overhead projectors, maps, globes, charts, and slide projectors.

The exhibit is open to the public for the duration of the conference. It is housed in Room 02, the audio-visual room in Peabody Hall, the building housing the University's School of Education. Demonstrators and representatives from various companies are on hand to explain and operate the machines.

In addition to the exhibits, the conference has been attended by national and regional leaders in the new media of instruction who have spoken on the pros and cons of utilization of the newer media.

Speakers

Speakers include Dr. Lawrence M. Stolorow, professor of psychology and education at the University of Illinois; Dr. Harold Wigren of the National Education Association; Dr. Mary Scott, Department of Elementary School Principals, NEA; Paul S. Flynn, N. C. State Department of Public Instruction; Walter Stone, U. S. Office of Education; Dr. Herbert Schueler, professor of education at Hunter College; Theodore Conant, consultant, Fund for the Advancement of Education, Ford Foundation; and Edward W. Rushton, superintendent of the Roanoke, Va., schools.

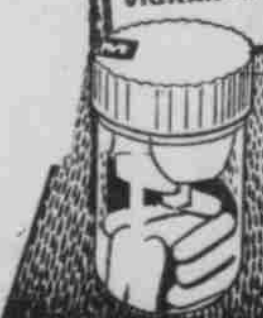
