Scale Model Of Chapel Hill Rises In Ackland Basement

By Nancy Barr In a cluttered workroom in the basement of Ackland a city is rising—Chapel Hill in miniature.

Constructed in plastic, the tiny scale model is an accurate architectural and topographical model of the UNC campus proper and surrounding environs.

With the tiny blocks and bits of plastic Director Frank Meldau and his three co-workers, David Kitzmiller, John Stockard and Anna Robbins, have rebuilt the campus on a scale of 1/50 of an inch to one foot.

From the stadium to the planetarium, the model includes every structure visible on the UNC campus as well as a few buildings still in the planning stage. On the layout the Ehringhaus and Burton Craig dormitories, Coker Hall (botany), Toy-Dey (foreign languages), the public health building and the additions to Hill and Swain halls are completed and in the proper locations.

Hand-Cut Levels Each topographical level, carefully cut by hand, equals a two-foot contour interval. Since the layout includes a 290-foot variance in levels, the highest point on the model is made of 145 different hand-carved levels.

The scale model has 110 major buildings, not including the Memorial Hospital complex. Each of these university-owned buildings is reconstructed accurately in shape, scale color and design. Each column, window and door are visible on the tiny buildings.

Even UNC trees, parking lots, paths and streets will be included on the model. Over 2000 miniature trees, made of lichen, wire, glue and green spray paint have been fashioned already. The parking lots and streets will be painted in an asphalt color.

Besides the major buildings, the scale model includes 300 minor buildings in the downtown Chapel Hill area, nearby residential areas

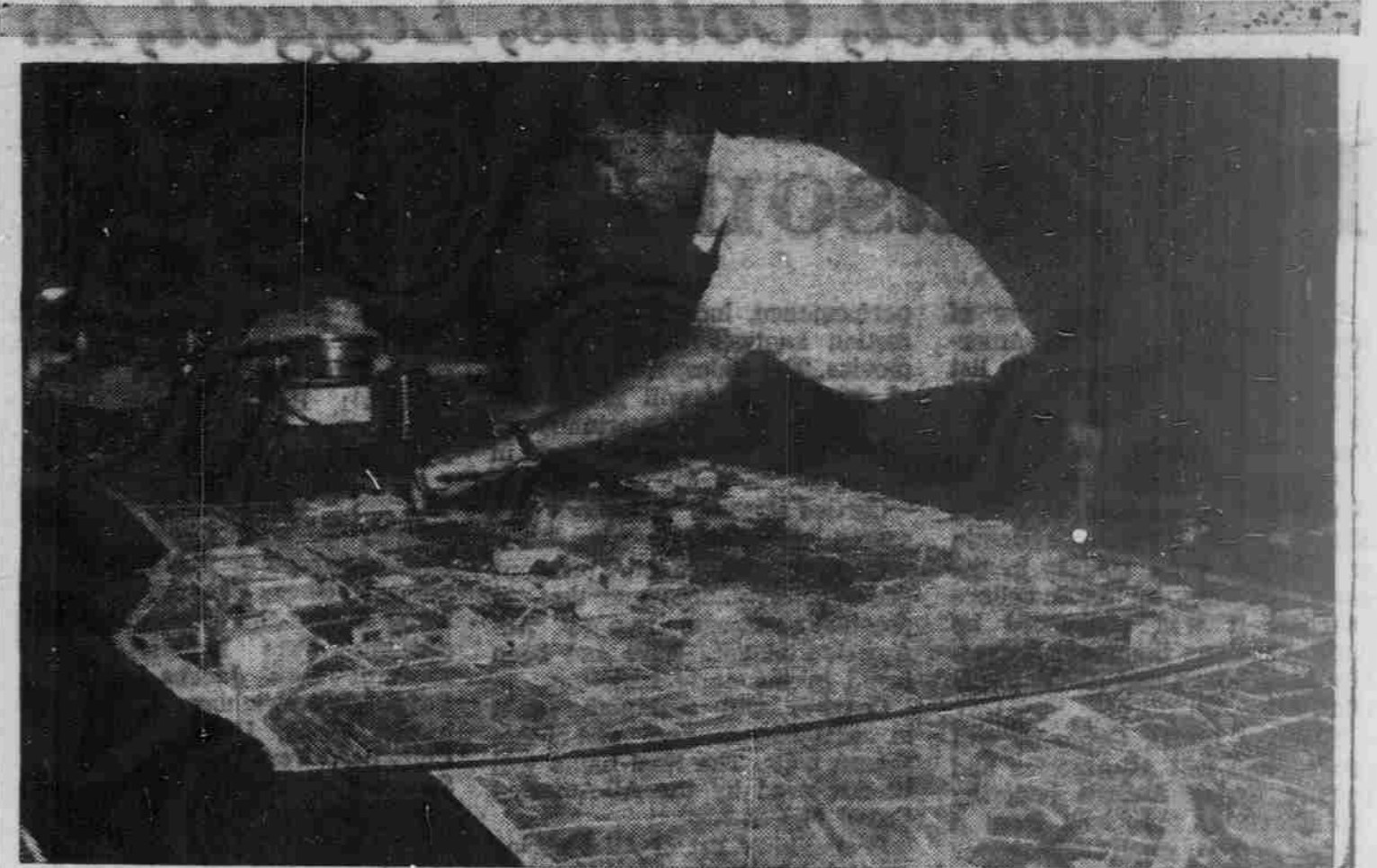
and Victory Village. For the most part these buildings are accurate in shape and scale, but Victory Village is also painted in the actual colors of the various living units.

Major Undertaking

The scale model, which measures about 14x16 feet, is a major undertaking for Meldau who has been working on it for almost a year. Before the actual construction began, aerial photographs of the campus and original blueprints of all the university buildings had to be found or especially made. Buildings like the Monogram Club and private homes for which there were no blueprints available had to be accurately measured and planned.

Once the scale model is completed, it will be used in the long-range planning of the physical growth of the university. Architects and officials of the university will be able to see readily the ground areas and locations of the buildings as well as the land levels on which new buildings must be constructed.

Various officials of the university have already seen the model, but its first public debut will not be until October when it will be displayed at the North Carolina Trades Fair in Charlotte. After several scheduled tours, the model will be returned to UNC where it will be on public display.

The unveiling ceremonies of the portrait of former Governor O. Max Gardner, to be held at Carolina Saturday, will feature speeches by former Consolidated University presidents, the present governor and the past governor.

Frank P. Graham and Gordon Gray, former presidents of the Consolidated University, Governor Terry Sanford and former Gov. Luther H. Hodges, Secretary of Commerce, will take part in the ceremonies. Gardner was governor of the state during the period when the three branches of the University were consolidated and considered the consolidation as one of the major accomplishments of his career.

Hill Ceremonies

The portrait, which will be unveiled at ceremonies in Hill Hall at 11 a.m. September 30, is a gift to the University by the Gardner family. Albert Murray, of New York, is the painter of the portrait. Mrs. O. Max Gardner of Shelby will present the portrait which will be received by President William C. Friday.

O. Max Gardner III of Shelby will engage in the actual unveiling of the portrait. Chancellors of the

three institutions of the Consolidated University, William B. Aycock, Otis Singletary of Woman's College and John Caldwell of N. C. State College will be present at the ceremonies which are open to the public.

The invocation will be given by Chancellor Emeritus Robert B. House and the Rev. Marion DuBose Jr., minister of the Kings Mountain Baptist Church, will deliver the benediction.
