

Interviews For Orientation Counselors Begin Monday

Program Needs 200 Students

Interviews for 200 orientation counselors for next fall will be held on Monday through Friday of next week in the Woodhouse and Gail rooms of Graham Memorial, Orientation Chairman Bob Madry announced yesterday.

Madry said that about 200 counselors will be needed to properly run the program for next year's freshmen and transfers. This will be a record number, a result of the highest enrollment ever expected by the Admissions Office.

Forms Due Sunday

Applications can be picked up at the Seattlbut, Graham Memorial, Y-Court, and the desk of the Reserve Reading Room of the library. These should be turned in at the information desk at Graham Memorial at which time the applicant can sign up for an interview. All applications are due on Sunday.

Madry said that the men chosen as counselors will be trained at three sessions, scheduled for April 9, 26, and May 3. Group dynamics, academics, and an introduction to

the Orientation Manual will be taken up at these meetings.

"Rewarding"

"We feel that the position of orientation counselor can be one of the most rewarding opportunities the Carolina student is offered," Chairman Madry said. "I hope that every interested student will come down for an interview."

Lecture Is Set By Van Til

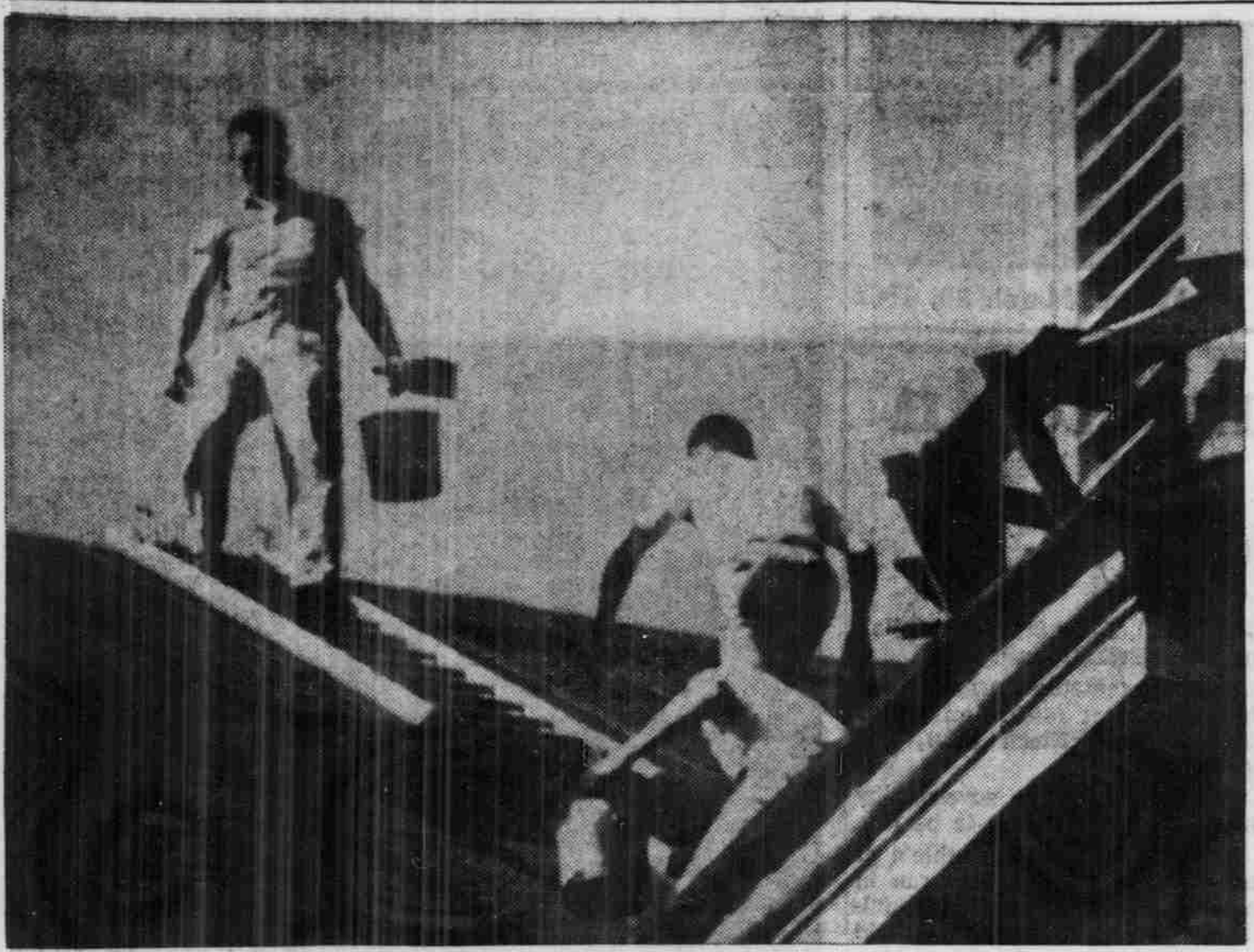
Dr. William Van Til, one of the nation's leading educators and chairman of the department of Secondary Education at New York University, will be the principal speaker at the annual Phi Delta Kappa Education Lecture to be held here April 3.

The subject of Dr. Til's talk will be "Curriculum Frontiers for the 1960's" and the public is invited.

Prior to Dr. Til's arrival at New York University in 1957, he had served on the faculties of George Peabody College, the University of Illinois and Ohio State University.

In the period 1951-57, he co-founded the Nashville Community Relations Conference and served as chairman of the community workshops on desegregation of schools. Dr. Til has edited numerous books, a quarterly magazine, and has been a researchist and writer for the Consumer Education Study of the National Education Association. His first teaching post was in a school for juvenile delinquents.

He is president-elect of the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, a major professional organization; vice-president of the John Dewey Society and a board member; and yearbook editor of the National Council for the Social Studies.

Kennedy Would Debate Again In 1964 Presidential Race

WASHINGTON (UPI)—President Kennedy Thursday apparently disposed of any doubts that he plans to seek a second White House term in 1964.

At one point in his news conference, a reporter pointed out that Kennedy's 1960 Republican opponent, former Vice President Richard M. Nixon, had indicated in his book that Nixon felt he won three of their four 1960 television debates. The President was asked if he thought future debates were advisable.

"I would think that it would be part of the 1964 campaign," he said in jocular fashion.

"I would be glad to debate, even if I did, as the vice president suggested, lose three out of four."

Kennedy told a news conference some weeks ago that he had his own ideas about whether or not Nixon should seek the California governorship. Asked Thursday if

he could disclose this judgment, the Chief Executive drew a big laugh when he said:

"I said at the time I would be glad to discuss it with him and he has not yet spoken to me about it. I will be glad to go back to California."

LESSON 5—The importance of head control
