

## Aycock Announces Faculty Appointments, Resignations

New faculty appointments, promotions, leaves of absence and resignations from the University were announced today by Chancellor William B. Aycock, following approval by the President and the trustees' executive committee.

Two new faculty members are Henry H. Dearman, Statesville native who comes to Chapel Hill from the University of Chicago to be an assistant professor in the Department of Chemistry, and Ruth Elaine Stone of Charlotte who is appointed a lecturer-librarian in the School of Library Science. Kenneth J. Leslie of Michigan State University was appointed an assistant professor in Psychiatry, School of Medicine.

Dr. David R. Hawkins was promoted to the rank of professor in the Department of Psychiatry in the School of Medicine. Dr. Thomas E. Curtis was promoted to associate professor in the Medical School. Dr. Clifton E. Crandell was promoted to associate professor in the School of Dentistry. Dr. Burton H. Kaplan was promoted to assistant professor in the School of Public Health.

Leaves of absence have been granted to Prof. Stephen Eney, Philosophy Department, to complete professional publication work; Prof. Maurice A. Natanson, Philosophy Department, to be a visiting professor at Pennsylvania State College; Prof. Ralph W. Pfouts, School of Business Administration, to do research under a Ford Foundation grant; Prof. A. C. Howell, English Department, to be a visiting professor at the University of Paraguay; Dr. Louis G. Welt, School of Medicine, to do research at Duke University; and Prof. John Charles Morrow, Department of Chemistry, to do research at the University of Heidelberg, Germany.

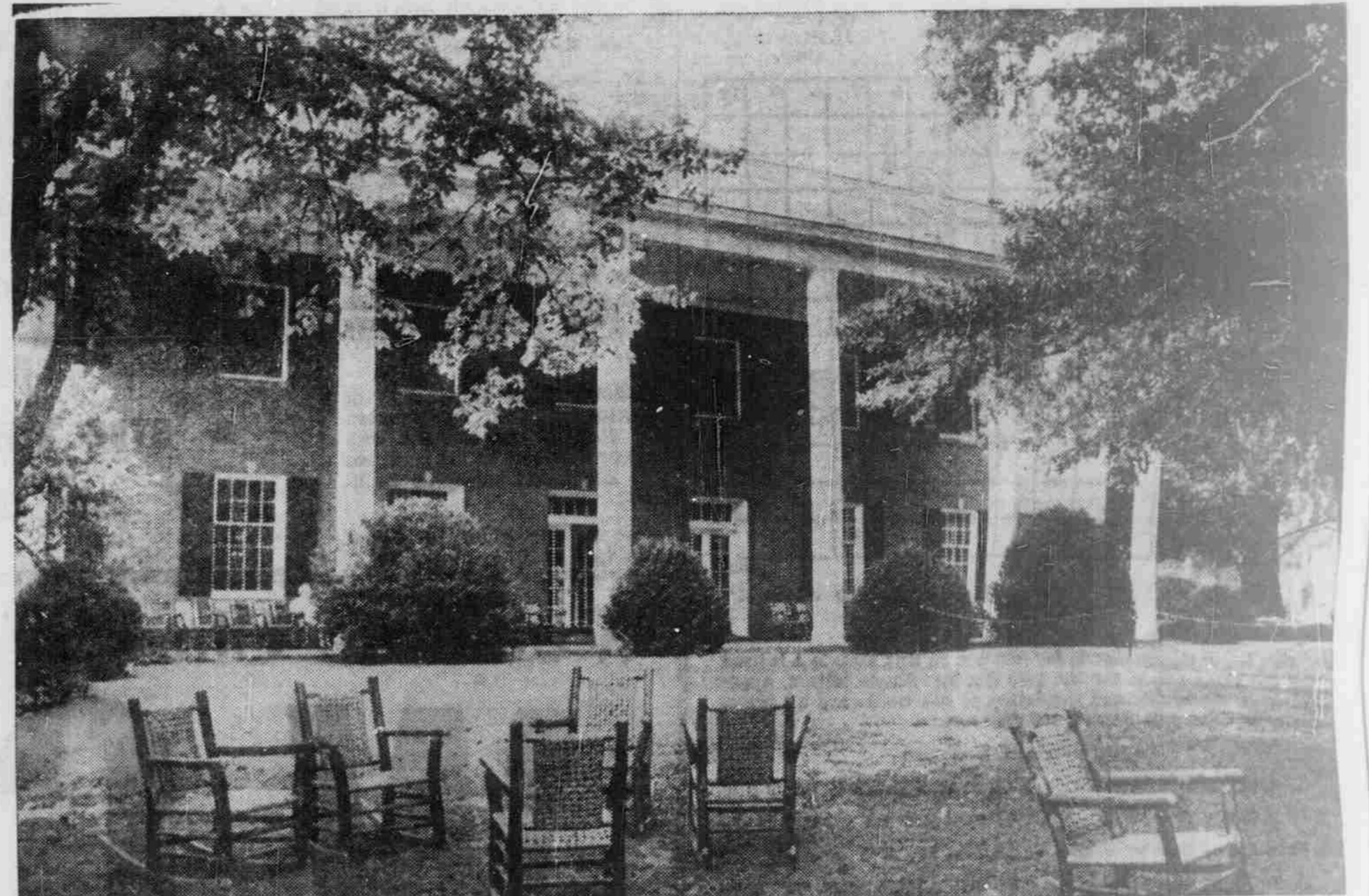
