The Council ruled that signing a class roll strongly implied to the professor that the student had attended the entire class unless he had had to leave for a reason made clear to the professor. It felt that signing and then leaving was a form of lying about his presence in the class. He was found guilty and given an official reprimand.

In the third case, the defendant had come about five minutes late to class and had stood outside the partly-open door gesticulating to his friends in back

to sign him in. This was the student seen by the person who reported the possibility of the class roll being

falsified. He was signed in, but said he did not know who did it. He said that when he left, he was not even sure that anyone had seen him gesturing.

He pleaded guilty and was found guilty. He was sentenced to one semester probation.

The Council felt that this case had been a more flagrant sort of lying than in the case where the student left half way through A freshman was found innocent

of lying to his professor in a case carried over from last week. The defendant said he had received a crank phone call telling him of his grandmother's death. He could not get through to his parents on the phone, so he went
