Godfrey Given High Honor

Dr. James Logan Godfrey, historian and dean of the faculty here, has been named Distinguished University Professor.

The Trustees Executive Committee approved the appointment last Friday following recommendation by Chancellor William B. Aycock and approval by President William C. Friday.

Dean Godfrey is the second to hold the title Distinguished University Professor. The title was held by Robert B. House after his retirement as Chancellor in 1957 and until he formally retired as a member of the faculty at the age of 70.

Dr. Godfrey is a professor of English History and is a Fellow in the Royal Historical Society.

He has been a member of the faculty here since 1936. He received his M.A. degree at Chapel Hill in 1933, after receiving the A.B. degree at Roanoke College in Virginia. He received the Ph.D. degree at the University of Chicago in 1942,

He has taught summer sessions at Harvard University, William and Mary, and the University of Missouri,

Dr. Godfrey is a native of Roanoke, Va. His wife is the former Eleanor Smith, a native of Shelton, Neb. She received her Ph.D. in history at the University of Chicago, They have two children.

Dr. Godfrey is a member of several scholarly and professional organizations, including his distinction as a Fellow in the Royal Historical Society and his executive council membership in the Southern Historical Association. He also holds membership in the American Historical Association and is an associate editor of "The Journal of British Studies."

In London and Paris he carried on research in English and History and the history of the French Revolution. He is the author of a study on the French Revolutionary Tribunal published by the UNC Press and the coauthor of a college textbook entitled "Europe Since 1815." He has written several University Library Extension bulletins and has contributed a number of

articles to learned journals. During his stay in Europe and at other times he has written articles for newspapers, chiefly on the economic situation in Britain. He is an authority on the Labor government and has for some time, been working on a book covering history of Great Britain from 1945 to 1951, with emphasis on the Labor government.
