

# Nursing School Receives Federal Funds

Federal funds totaling about one-quarter million dollars are being made available to the UNC School of Nursing to help practicing nurses update the skills and techniques they need in their day-to-day jobs.

Six federal grants have been approved to finance a long-range, comprehensive continuation education program for nursing teachers, administrators, and supervisors and practicing nurses.

These grants range from a single appropriation of \$4,000 for faculty development in diploma schools of nursing up to a four-year grant of \$132,000 to improve the nursing care of the aged and aging.

Dr. Eloise R. Lewis, professor of nursing, Margaret C. Moce, assistant professor of nursing, and Mrs. Mary Snyder, instructor in nursing, have been assigned full time to the expanded continuation education program here.

The program, as they envision it, is based on the premise that there are many able nurses now in leadership positions who need and want further development of their skills, but who can't, for any number of reasons, leave

their jobs for an extended period of study. These nurses can and will attend short, intensive study courses several times each year.

No other school of nursing in North Carolina provides an opportunity for continuation education in nursing.

What is the UNC School of Nursing doing with the nearly \$250,000 in federal funds?

The general pattern of the continuation education program is to bring the same group of nurses to Chapel Hill to work on a subject for five days, repeated three or four times each year.

This pattern began to take shape in June when 30 administrators of diploma schools of nursing from the Carolinas and Virginia spent five days in the classroom here studying the principles and techniques of administration. They will return next month and again in January and April.

This program is sponsored by the U. S. Public Health Service with an initial grant of \$13,000, with equal amounts each year for the next two years.

Later this month, 30 faculty members from diploma schools of nursing will be here for a five day session designed to assist them in learning more about teaching the late adolescent student. This course will be repeated in November and again in February.

### SILVER GETS AWARD

Frank Morris Silver of Leaksville has won a \$500 scholarship award to UNC from Chemstrand, announced Dr. Julian Mason, director of Student Aid.

Officially designated as the "Chemstrand Company, a Division of Monsanto Company Award," the scholarship is given annually to a chemistry major who shows interest in a career in industry and demonstrates scholastic excellence.

Silver, is a senior and a member of Alpha Chi Sigma professional chemistry fraternity.

In mid-October, ten administrators of collegiate schools of nursing will arrive to spend five days studying the principles of administrative organization and leadership. An \$8,000 federal grant for each of three years is making this program possible.

Scheduled for late October — and to be repeated for different groups next March and May — will be a five-day course to assist collegiate nursing faculty members in increasing their skills in understanding college students as learners.

Teachers in programs for practical nurses will seek a better understanding of the adult student as a learner at a five-day continuation education session here in late November. This session will be repeated next March.

A \$30,000 grant, renewable in the same amount each year for another three years, will be used to improve the nursing care of the aged and aging. This gerontology grant is from the Chronic Disease Division of the U. S. Public Health Service.

Instruction in gerontology will be provided for teachers in all types of nursing programs — collegiate, hospital and technical education institutions — and for supervisors, heard nurses and practitioners in all types of health agencies.

And, finally, the N. C. State Board of Health and the UNC School of Nursing are working jointly on a long-range program to improve the nursing care of expectant mothers and newborn babies. A pilot session is scheduled in November for teachers of maternal and child health in nursing schools, public health nurses and nurse supervisors of obstetrics and pediatrics. They will spend three days at UNC studying the health aspects of pregnancy and childbirth.

The directors of UNC's unique continuation education program emphasize that their plans under

the federal grants do not preclude the sponsorship of short-term (one, two and three-day) courses to be set up as nurses in the state make their needs known to the school here.

They envision in the near future a refresher course for currently inactive nurses wanting to return to full or part-time employment.

And there are plans for administrative training for directors of nursing in small (100-bed or under) hospitals in North Carolina.
