Presentations planned for the second semester will be Jose Milina Bailes Espanales, I Solisti Di Zabreb, Mariam Makeba, a production of "Beyond The Fringe," Peter Niro, Leon Bibb and the Serendipity Singers.

Performers in Graham Memorial's Jubilee Weekend have not yet been announced.

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**Behrman Joins UNC Staff To Develop BA Curriculum**

Dr. Jack N. Behrman will help the UNC School of Business Administration develop its curriculum in international business administration. Dr. Behrman resigned as assistant secretary of commerce for international and domestic business affairs to accept appointment as professor of international business administration at the University, the White House announced last month. Dr. Behrman, a native of Wa-

co, Texas, took his A.B. degree from Davidson College in 1943. He received his M.A. degree from the University here in 1945 and his Ph.D. from Princeton University in 1952. He joined the U. S. Department of Commerce in March of 1961. Dr. Behrman was a member of the Washington and Lee University faculty from 1952 until 1957. From 1957 until 1961 he was a professor at the University of Delaware.

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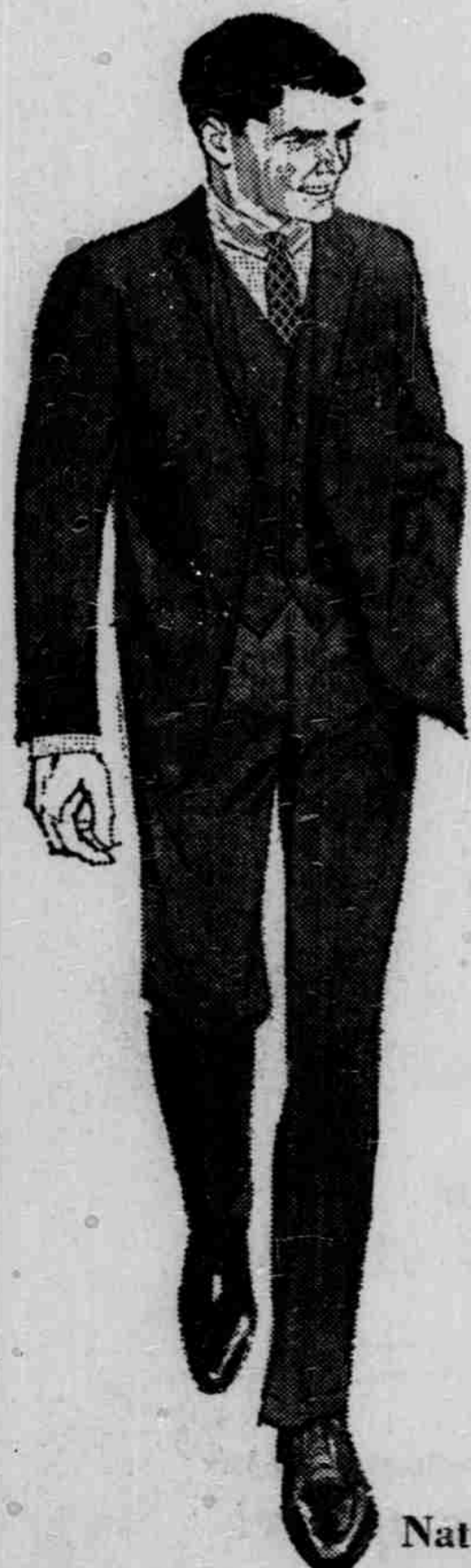
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
