The dash down the sidelines eclipsed a record-shattering performance by Navy's Roger Staubach, who only seconds before had thrown a third touchdown pass to put Navy ahead, 22-21.

Staubach's 25 completions in 39 attempts broke the Naval Academy record he had set last week against Notre Dame. His passes accounted for 231 yards and all their touchdowns.

Phil Petry, starting quarterback in an all-sophomore backfield, was equally effective, passing for two scores and running for the other. He had powerful help from tailback Tom Hickey whose line smashes kept the offense moving.

Maryland, winning only its third game and handing Navy its fifth loss, struck for two touchdowns before Navy could get into the game, and led until a Staubach to Calvin Huey pass put the Middies ahead with 2:58.

But before the cheers from the Navy stands could subside, Ambrusko grabbed the kickoff and was off on his touchdown gallop to snatch the victory away.






