ACC Leaders Duke, NC State Will Travel Outside Conference To Navy, Florida State

(AP) — While pace-setting North Carolina State and runner-up Duke visit fields of non-league opponents Saturday, North Carolina and Wake Forest, each with a chance to tie for the Atlantic Coast Conference football title, hope to gain on the leaders.

N.C. State has a toughie in a night game at Florida State and Duke, beaten in its last two outings, plays Navy at Annapolis, Md.

These excursions against outsiders leave the way open for North Carolina and Wake Forest to gain ground at the expense of the teams on the bottom of the conference ladder. North Carolina plays at Virginia and Wake Forest is at South Carolina.

Clemson is at Maryland to round out the schedule for the next to last week of the season for all teams except Duke, which has a hurricane-delayed game at Tulane two weeks from now.

Duke's stunning loss to Wake Forest last week dropped the Blue Devils into second place on a 3-1-1 record behind N.C. State 5-1. North Carolina and Wake Forest share third place at 3-2.

North Carolina came up with a strong performance last week in routing Clemson and the Tar Heels still may gain a share of the title. They have to beat Virginia, 0-4, in the conference, and follow up with victory over Duke next week to keep their chances for the title alive.

For North Carolina to gain a tie, Wake Forest must knock off N.C. State next Friday night. If the Deacons beat South Carolina and N.C. State they can tie the league-leading Wolfpack for the crown.

Wake Forest, 4-4, for all games, needs one more victory to attain its best record in five years. The Deacons have in fullback Brian Piccolo the nation's leading rusher and scorer among major teams. His 20-point effort against Duke earned him this week's Associated Press Back of the Week honors.

The Clemson-Maryland game, often a battle of teams with title aspirations, has been reduced to a meeting of second division clubs. Maryland has been rough on the Tigers, beating them seven times and tying one in 12 previous meetings. Duke is the only other ACC team with an edge over Clemson.

best teams, having been beaten only once. The Seminoles have beaten N.C. State in five of seven previous meetings, including a 14-0 victory over the Wolfpack team that last year was co-champion of the ACC.

Duke will be after its second victory over the service academies, having beaten Army last month. Navy hasn't won a game since taking its first two. In the last six Middles have only a tie with Pittsburgh. Duke has won only five of 20 previous games in the series, Navy taking 10 and five ending up in ties.
