

Fall In Bathroom Kills Duke Nurse

A Duke Hospital nurse died Sunday afternoon in her Chapel Hill home, apparently from an accidental fall which knocked her unconscious into a bathtub full of water.

Mrs. Margaret Reese, 54, of 94 Hamilton Rd., Glen Lennox, was found submerged in the tub after her living companion entered the apartment and heard the water running in the bathroom.

Police Chief William Blake said the death was apparently caused by an accidental fall backwards into the tub. An autopsy has been ordered by police.

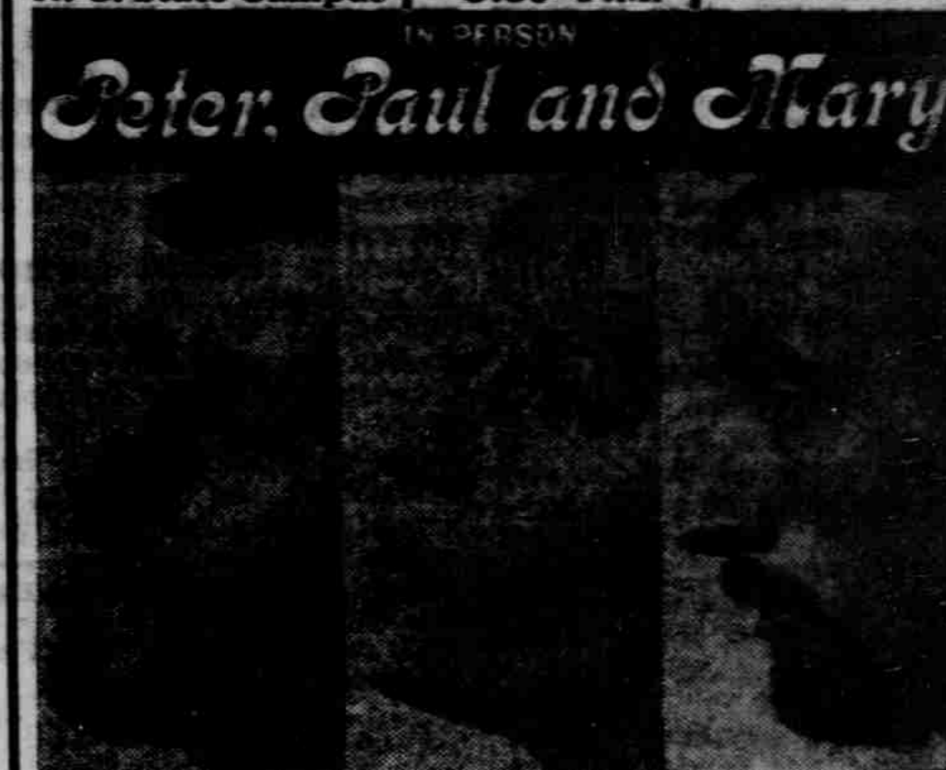

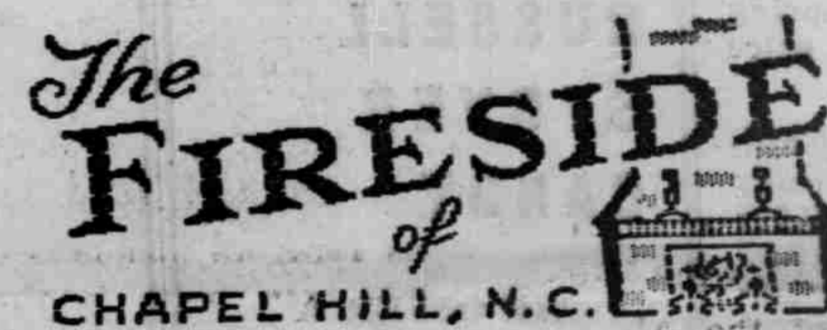

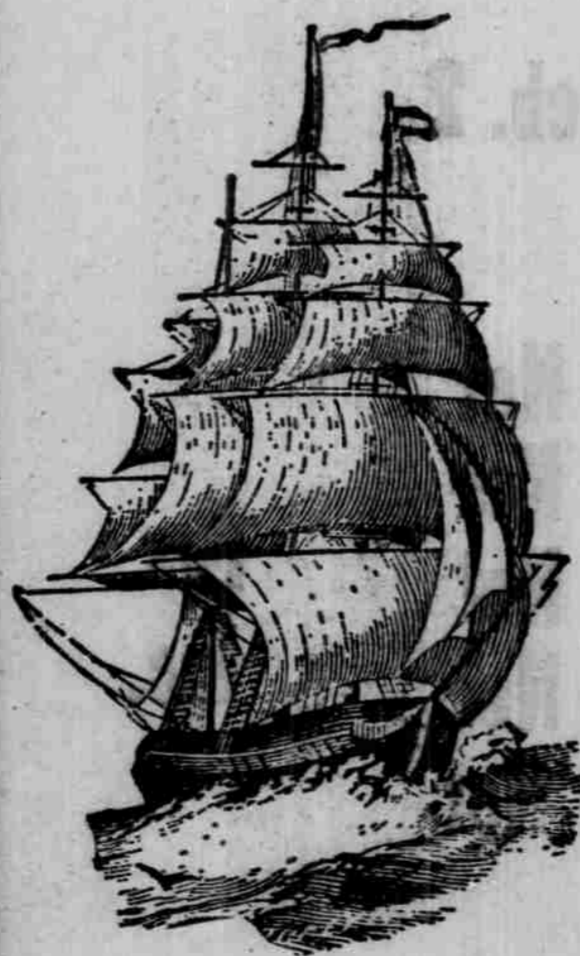
