

Thinclads Win Opener Over State

Carolina's track squad opened the outdoor season with an impressive 97 - 48 victory over N. C. State yesterday on a rain-soaked Fetzer Field. The Tar Heel Thinclads copped firsts in 13 of the sixteen events to completely overwhelm the

visiting Wolfpack. The dreary weather which prevailed throughout the meet was overshadowed by a leg injury sustained by sophomore sprinter Jon Levin. Coach Joe Hilton predicted the cramped muscle would sideline his speedster during this weekend's Florida's Relays.

Dale White won the 100-yard dash in which Levin was injured, and later copped the 220 dash. Other first places for UNC were captured by Art Maillet, Ed Daw, Bo Wood, John Johnson, Bill Graham, Charlie Little, Jerry Smith, and Rich Ambrose.

The Tar Baby cindermen also won easily by a 90 - 46 margin. Mike Williams, Ronnie Short, Jim Frye, Mike Morgan, Tom Carpenter, Tom Perry, Bill

Mitchell, Arch Hicks, and Bill Bassett took firsts in their division.

Depth through the seven man team is developing into the Tar Heel's main strength. The eighth and ninth men on the squad appear to be as likely to break par as the number one man.

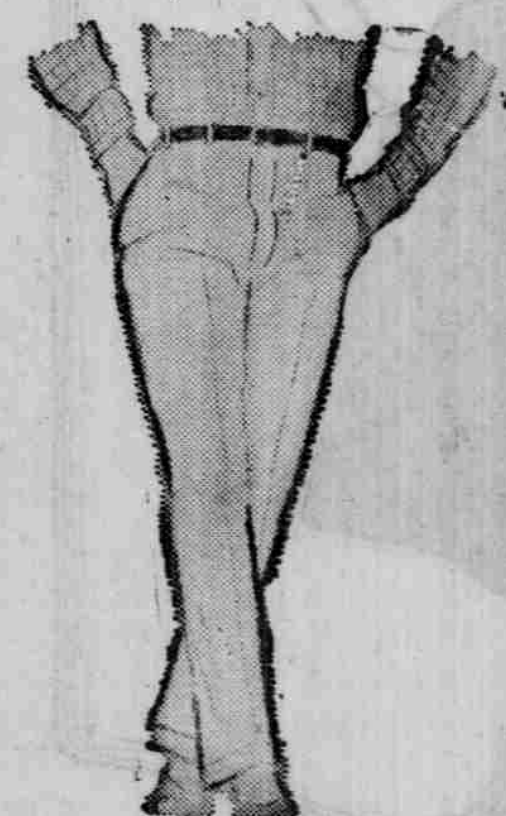
John Baldwin, the lone junior on the team, played the number one position and fired a 73.

Tar Heels Bombard High Point In Exhibition Slugfest, 10-0

The Tar Heels yesterday clobbered three High Point pitchers for 12 hits and 10 runs to defeat the Panthers 10 - 0 in an exhibition game shortened after five and one - half innings because of rain.

Every player in the opening lineup except for starting pitcher Jerry Davis hit safely. Left-fielder Bob Hume knocked in three runs on a single and a two - run homer.

Catcher John Shaw, shortstop Dick Fleming and third baseman Bob Bonzcek also had two hits apiece.

The Tar Heels wasted no time as they scored twice in the first inning. Gary Black was hit by a pitch, Danny Talbott singled and Shaw singled to right scoring Black. Hume then lined a single to right - center to score Talbott.

In the second Fleming singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on Dick Prindle's single. Prindle went around to third when the High Point catcher threw the ball into center on a stolen base, and after Talbott walked and stole second, Shaw brought them both home with a single.

UNC boosted the lead to 7-0 in the third on a walk to Hume, a single by Bonzcek on which he reached second on an error by the second baseman, and a triple by Fleming.

Hume's two - run blast in the fifth and Ken Boykin's single following a triple by Black in the sixth gave the Tar Heels their final two runs.

Davis allowed only one hit and struck out four in his three innings, while Bill Danneman allowed three hits and struck

out three in the final three.

For Coach Walter Rabb the game was quite encouraging from every standpoint. The whole lineup came through with some solid hits and on defense both pitchers looked good and the infield played well. Bonzcek made a fine play in the first on a topped roller down the third - base line.

After a final exhibition game at East Carolina Saturday, the Tar Heels will open the regular season against Colgate Monday.
