"Come on," yelled another, "let's warm up."

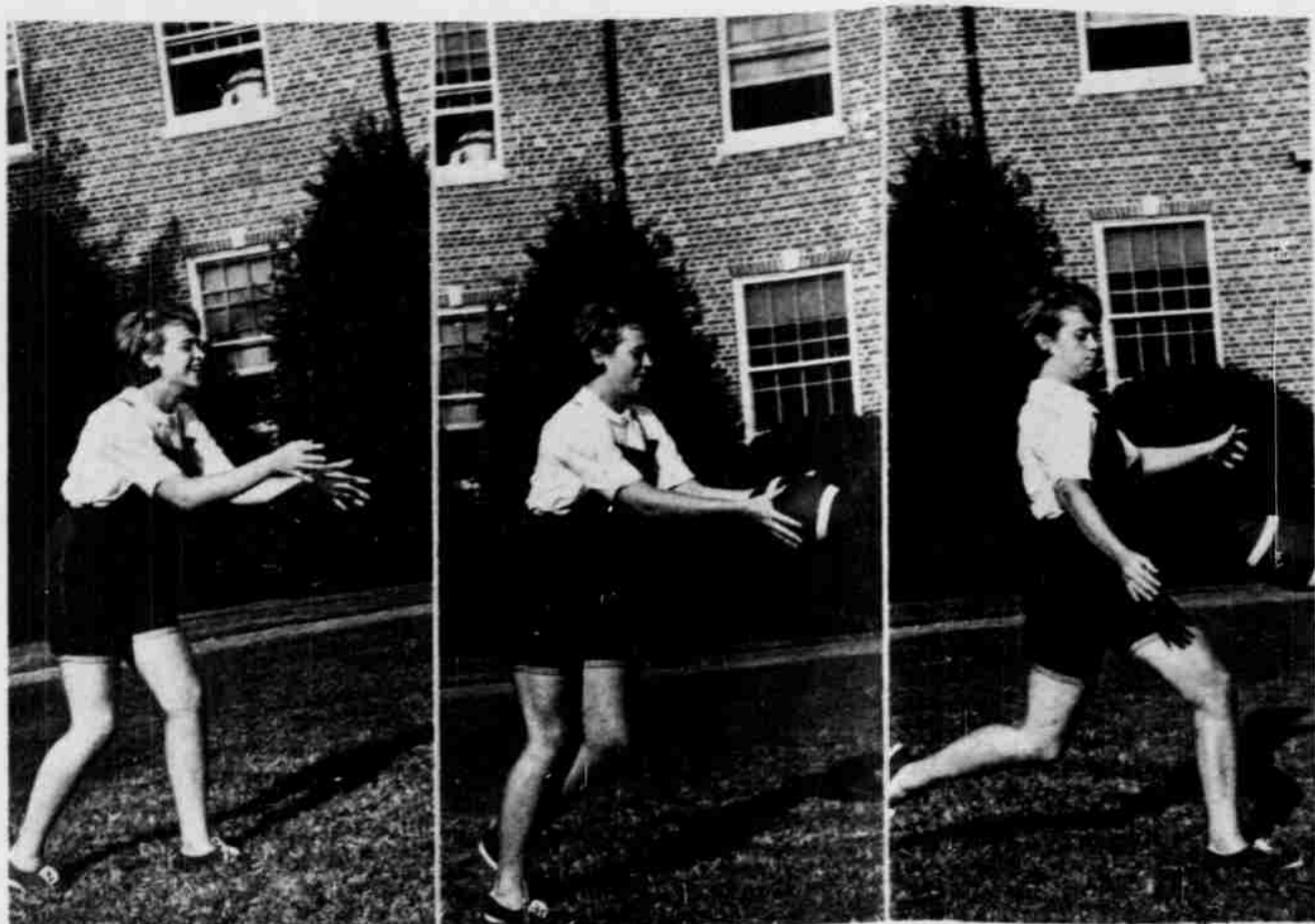
"I played left tackle in high school, and I'm pretty good too," said one well-put-together brunette.

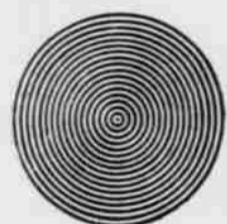
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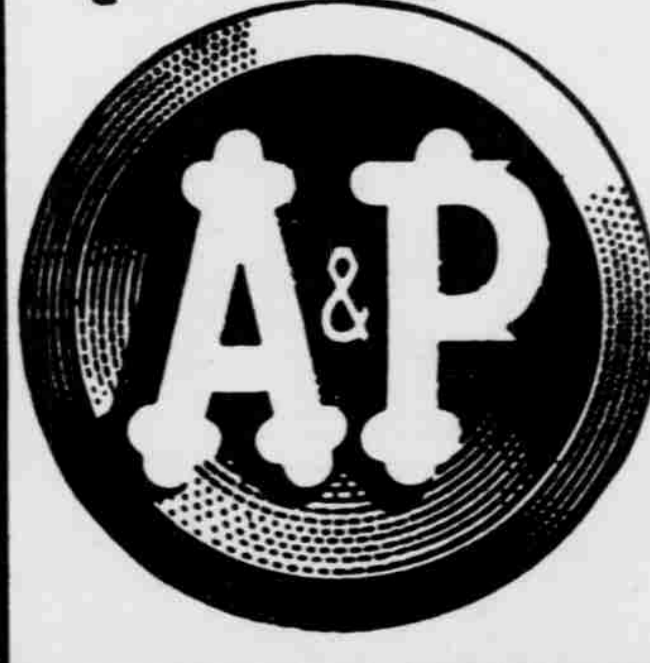
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
