### Miami Downs UNC Netters

Immovable force met immovable force yesterday on UNC's tennis courts when undefeated Miami challenged undefeated Carolina. The Tar Heels lost 6-3.

At first singles, Gene Hamilton countered Jamie Fillol's powerful attack with his steady, resourceful game concentrated on his opponent's backhand. Although Hamilton dropped the first set, Fillol weakened noticeably in the second when Hamilton exploded for five straight games and the set. In the third, Fillol pulled together his confidence and his play regained his

earlier prowess. He seized a 4-0 lead and, on four service breaks, captured the set and the 6-3, 2-6, 6-2 match.

At second singles, Bob Davis played his finest match of the season as he dominated Tutvin 6-1, 6-3.

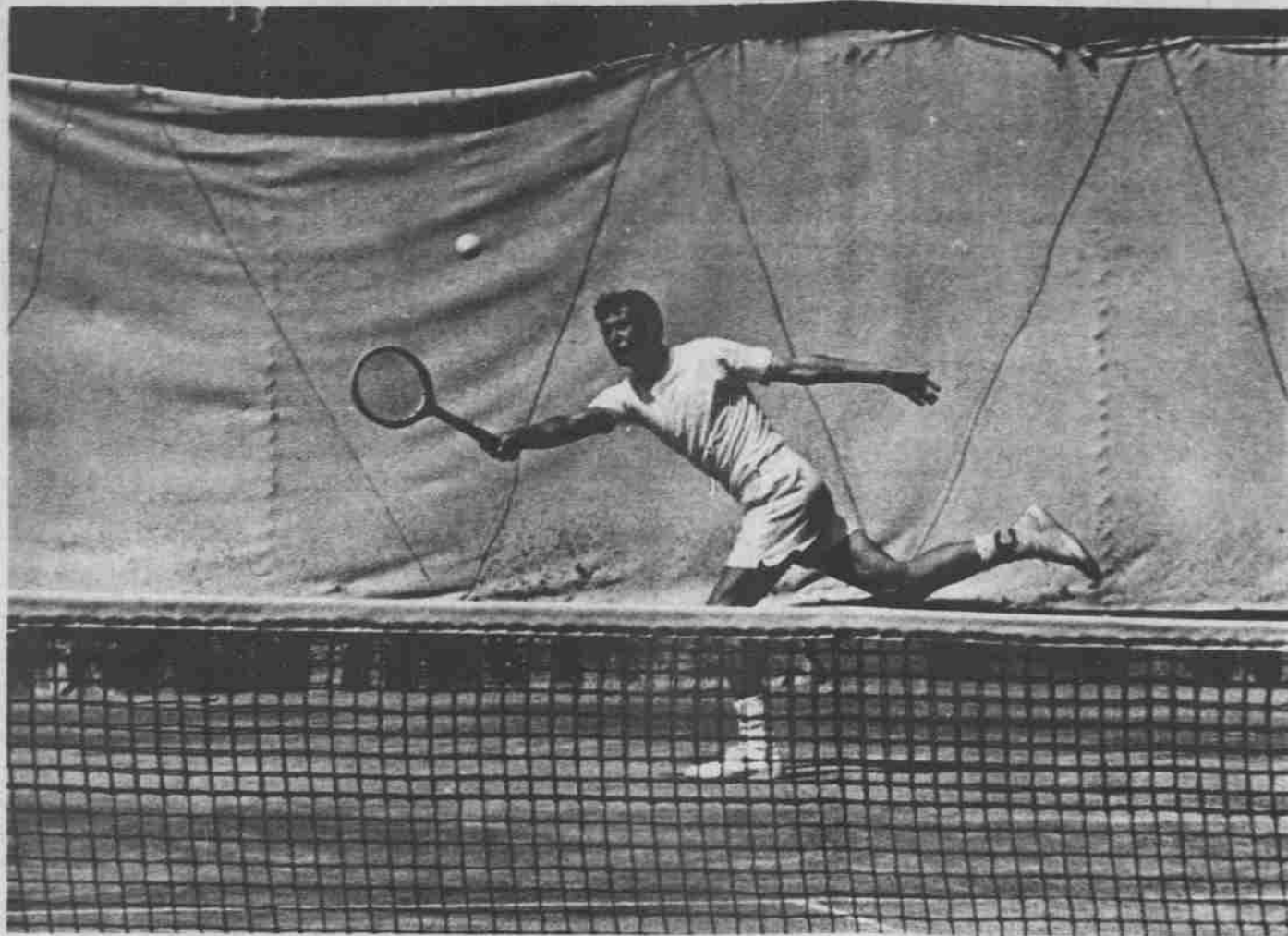




